"(F) Regarding the renovation, repair, and painting program, the director, not later than the thirty-first day of December of each year, shall report all of the following to the speaker and minority leader of the house of representatives and to the president and minority leader of the senate:

(1) The number of people educated through the program;

(2) The number of certifications issued for individuals under the program;

(3) The number of certifications issued for firms under the program;

(4) The number of reported violations of rules adopted under this section;

(5) The number of compliance-related interventions made under the program;

(6) The number of remediations resulting from those

<u>(8) The number of certifications revoked under the program.</u>	20
<u>(G) Not later than December 31, 2025, and every five years thereafter, the director shall survey other states that have entered into agreements with the United States environmental protection agency for the administration and enforcement of the renovation, repair, and painting rule to determine best practices that have been effective in increasing education concerning the rule and increasing compliance with the rule."</u>	22
