joinder agreement, or similar contract executed by an endorsing	35

(D) "Game" means a national or international competition	38
or other event, such as a player draft or commemoration,	39

(E) "Joinder agreement" means an agreement entered into by	41

selection of a site in this state for the location of a game. 47 (F) "Joinder undertaking" means an agreement entered into 48 by a local organizing committee, endorsing municipality, or 49 endorsing county, or more than one endorsing municipality or 50 county acting collectively and a site selection organization 51 that each endorsing municipality or endorsing county will 52 execute a joinder agreement in the event that the site selection 53 organization selects a site in this state for a game. 54 (G) "Local organizing committee" means a nonprofit 55 corporation or its successor in interest that: 56 (1) Has been authorized by an endorsing municipality, 57 endorsing county, or more than one endorsing municipality or 58 59 county acting collectively to pursue an application and bid on the applicant's behalf to a site selection organization for 60 selection as the site of one or more games; or 61 (2) With the authorization of an endorsing municipality, 62 endorsing county, or more than one endorsing municipality or 63 county acting collectively, has executed an agreement with a 64 site selection organization regarding a bid to host one or more 65 games. 66 (H) "Site selection organization" means the national or 67 international governing body of a sport that is recognized as 68 such by the endorsing municipality, endorsing county, or local 69 70 organizing committee. (I) "Sport" means football, auto racing, rugby, cricket, 71 horse racing, mixed martial arts, boxing, baseball, or any sport 72 <u>competition</u> that is governed either or both of the following: 73 (1) Governed by an international federation and included ; 74

(J) "Qualifying costs" means the costs to fulfill the	79

conduct of the game, including acquiring, renovating, or	85

Sec. 122.29. (A) The Ohio river commission is created	92
within the department of development to develop and promote	93
economic development, marine cargo terminal operations, and	94
travel and tourism on the Ohio river and its tributaries. The	95
commission consists of the following members:	96
(1) The director of development, or the director's	97
designee, who shall serve as chairperson of the commission;	98
(2) The director of transportation, or the director's	99
<u>designee;</u>	100
(3) The director of natural resources, or the director's	101

designee; 102 (4) Six members representing the general public, three of 103 whom shall be appointed by the president of the senate and three 104 of whom shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of 105 representatives. 106 The appointed members may represent private industry 107 108 associated or affiliated with marine cargo terminal operations on the Ohio river and private industry possessing experience in 109 marine cargo terminal operations or travel and tourism on the 110 Ohio<u>river.</u> 111 (B) (1) Each appointed member of the commission shall be a 112 resident of this state or a designee of a business licensed or 113 registered in this state. 114 (2) All members shall be reimbursed for actual expenses 115 incurred in the performance of their duties. 116 (C) (1) Within sixty days after the effective date of this 117 section, the speaker of the house of representatives and the 118 senate president shall make initial appointments to the 119 120 commission. 121 (2) Terms of office for appointed members shall be for 122 four years. (3) Vacancies shall be filled in the manner provided for 123 original appointments. 124 (4) Each term shall end on the same day of the same month 125 as did the term that it succeeds. Each appointed member shall 126 hold office from the date of the member's appointment until the 127 end of the term for which the member was appointed. secretary-treasurer and other employees that the commission	162
considers appropriate. The commission may fix the compensation	163

The funds, gifts, grants, or 216

bequests received pursuant to this section shall be deposited to 217 the Ohio river commission fund created in section 122.292 of the 218 Revised Code. 219 (B) The commission, or the department of development, on 220 behalf of the commission, may apply for and receive from the 221 United States government grants in accordance with any federal 222 law or program, for the benefit of Ohio river infrastructure, 223 transportation, or recreation and tourism. 224 225 Sec. 122.292. (A) The Ohio river commission fund is created in the state treasury. The fund consists of all money as 226 may be provided by law, including money received from any sale, 227 transfer, or lease of property and money received under division 228 (A) (13) of section 122.291 of the Revised Code. 229 (B) The Ohio river commission shall use money in the fund 230 to defray the commission's administrative expenses and to carry 231 out its purposes set forth in sections 122.29 to 122.292 of the 232 Revised Code. 233 Sec. 149.60. (A) The Ohio Ireland trade commission is 234 created. The commission shall study potential means of advancing 235 236 the following: (1) Bilateral trade and investment between Ohio and 237 Ireland; 238 (2) Policy issues of mutual interest to Ohio and Ireland; 239 (3) Business and academic exchanges between Ohio and 240 Ireland; 241 (4) Mutual economic support between Ohio and Ireland; 242 (5) Mutual investment in the infrastructure of Ohio and 243 244

BOE REIMBURSEMENT AND EDUCATION

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Upon completion of the May 6, 2025, primary and special 319 election, or as soon as possible thereafter, county boards of 320 elections shall certify to the Secretary of State the expenses 321 they incur for conducting the election that are eligible for 322 reimbursement under section 3501.17 of the Revised Code. 323

The foregoing appropriation item 050620, BOE Reimbursement324and Education, shall be used by the Secretary of State to325reimburse county boards of elections for all eligible expenses326they incur for conducting the May 6, 2025, primary and special327election.328

Notwithstanding section 127.19 of the Revised Code, on the329effective date of this section, or as soon as possible330thereafter, the Director of Budget and Management shall transfer331\$15,000,000 cash from the Controlling Board Emergency332Purposes/Contingencies Fund (Fund 5KM0) to the BOE Reimbursement333and Education Fund (Fund 5FG0).334

After reimbursing county boards of elections for eligible 335 expenses incurred in conducting the May 6, 2025, primary and 336 special election, but not later than September 1, 2025, the 337 Secretary of State shall certify the unexpended, unencumbered 338 portion of this appropriation to the Director of Budget and 339 Management. Upon receiving this certification, the Director of 340 Budget and Management shall transfer cash equal to the certified 341 amount from the BOE Reimbursement and Education Fund (Fund 5FG0) 342 to the Controlling Board Emergency Purposes/Contingencies Fund 343 (Fund 5KM0). 344

The foregoing appropriation item 042509, One Time

Strategic Community Investments, shall be used by the Office of 387 Budget and Management to provide grants for the projects listed 388 in this section in the amounts listed. Prior to disbursing a 389 grant to a recipient, the Office of Budget and Management shall 390 enter into a grant agreement with the recipient. As part of the 391 grant agreement, the recipient shall agree to complete a final 392 report, in a form and manner to be prescribed by the Office of 393 Budget and Management, detailing how the recipient used the 394 grant and submit the report to the Office of Budget and 395 396 Management.

An amount equal to the unexpended, unencumbered balance of397the foregoing appropriation item 042509, One Time Strategic398Community Investments, at the end of fiscal year 2025 is hereby399reappropriated for the same purpose in fiscal year 2026.400

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(5) Funding coordinated training between law enforcement, 993

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counterterrorism agencies, and emergency responders on either 994 the premises of a nonprofit corporation or through community- 995 wide training efforts; 996

(6) Continuing coverage of costs that were authorized and
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 paid for by a grant issued previously to the grantee in
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 accordance with this section in previous bienniums under the
 999
 program.

(B) (1) In addition to the purposes listed in division (A) 1001 1002 of this section, a nonprofit organization that serves a broad community or geographic area may apply for and receive grants to 1003 provide antiterrorism related services for its serviced 1004 community or area, including providing armed security personnel. 1005 Prior to receiving a grant under division (B) of this section, 1006 the nonprofit organization shall provide the Emergency 1007 Management Agency with any appropriate compliance documentation. 1008 The Agency shall establish what compliance documentation is 1009 required prior to issuing grants under this division. 1010

(2) If more than one nonprofit organization is located at
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the same address listed on the application, each nonprofit
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organization may apply for the full amount of a grant issued

(3) Discuss potential consequences to the organization if1031the site is damaged, destroyed, or disrupted by a terrorist;1032

(4) Describe how the grant will be used to integrate
organizational preparedness with broader state and local
preparedness efforts;

(5) Submit either a vulnerability assessment conducted by 1036 experienced security, law enforcement, or military personnel, or 1037 a credible intelligence and threat analysis from one or more 1038 qualified homeland security, counterintelligence, or antiterrorism experts, and a description of how the grant will be 1040 used to address the vulnerabilities identified in the 1041 assessment. 1042

The Agency shall consider all of the above factors in1043evaluating grant applications. The grantee shall have twenty-1044four months from the date of the first disbursement to meet1045program requirements. The Agency shall include information about1046the grants and the application process on its web site.1047

The Emergency Management Agency may prioritize a portion1048of funding, but not more than \$1,000,000 in each fiscal year,1049for innovative community-public safety partnerships addressing1050counterterrorism prevention, provided the grantee is eligible to1051receive the grant as a nonprofit organization that is at risk of1052
