House Bill 172 Proponent Testimony
November 8, 2023

Chairman Hillyer, Vice-Chair Mathews, Ranking Member Galonski, and Members of the House Civil Justice Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony today in support of House Bill 172, which seeks to modernize and update the Ohio Revised Code as it pertains to executing estate planning documents. HB 172 is companion legislation to Senate Bill 46, sponsored by Senator Roegner.

My name is Will Harnish and I am the Head of Digital Estate Planning for MetLife Legal Plans, which is headquartered in Cleveland. Prior to joining MetLife Legal Plans, I practiced Estate Planning for 8 years. I respectfully ask members of the Civil Justice Committee for your support of HB 172, which will allow Ohioans to sign and fully execute their estate plans online.

Currently, Ohio law allows you to create estate planning documents, such as wills, electronically. However, Ohioans cannot sign their documents without an in-person signing ceremony. In Ohio, you are unable to have your will signed and witnessed online by utilizing video conference. However, you can execute nearly all other important transactions such as real estate and loans online. The Ohio Supreme Court recently enacted rules that allow the vast majority of criminal and civil proceedings to be conducted remotely.

Today's technology can help those who cannot meet in-person execution requirements to create or update their estate planning documents. At MetLife Legal Plans, we have an online execution process in place and working in other states which has helped thousands of families create their estate plans online. *Ohio already took a step in this direction with its e-notary bill in 2019.*

Enacting this bill to allow wills and estate plans to be signed online through video conference is a logical next step. Furthermore, it will allow MetLife to move our notary headquarters and associated jobs from outside of Ohio to the Cleveland area.

I think we can all agree the COVID-19 pandemic required all of us and every industry to make adjustments in our everyday lives, both at work and at home. Today's technology, along with videoconferencing, allowed many of us to carry on our duties despite the lack of in-person contact during the pandemic. This crisis also showed us that many state laws needed updating to match the available technology options that have empowered us to move forward in these difficult times.

I had the privilege of being able to demonstrate to many of you on the Committee through videoconference meetings how our technology currently assists those seeking to create and execute estate planning documents entirely online. I would be happy to answer any questions Committee Members have about HB 172 and how it will benefit many of your constituents.
