Dear Chairman Phil Plummer:

Since 1912, Ohioans have used citizen-led ballot initiatives to have a direct say in our government. HJR 1 would make it much more difficult to get issues on the ballot, and would require a much higher "yes" vote to pass, once on the ballot.

HRJ 1 is <u>undemocratic</u> and an attack on all Ohioans' ability to pass citizen-initiated ballot measures. It undermines the sacred principle of one person, one vote, and would end majority rule in Ohio as we know it. It would allow 41% of voters to block initiatives the majority want. That shreds our constitution, and takes away our right as voters to decide what happens.

It's <u>unfair and unnecessary</u>, as citizens must already secure hundreds of thousands of signatures in at least half of Ohio's 88 counties, and it's been 5 years since the last one. This proposed resolution would make it almost impossible for anyone except big money special interests to successfully pass a ballot initiative, rigging the process against everyday Ohioans. Proposals like this are extremely <u>unpopular</u>, especially in conservative states. If this passes, only Florida and Ohio would require 60% support for a citizen-led ballot initiative.

I am opposed to HJR 1.
