I oppose changing the requirements for citizen led initiatives for changes to our laws. The requirement to get the required amount of signatures from all 88 counties instead of 44 counties is excessive as is requiring a 60% vote on legislation initiated by citizens.

My testimony opposing HJR1:

Majority rule on elections is the basis of democracy. A majority is 50% plus 1. Arbitrarily requiring 60% of the vote puts your thumb on the scale against Ohio citizens. That is undemocratic. Legislation by the state House and Senate only requires a simple majority. All other matters citizens vote on require only a simple majority. Manipulating the rules against citizen led initiatives has no defense except that you do

not want any of them to succeed. That is not democratic and your job is to operate within a democracy.
Do not begin carving out anti-democracy rules in Ohio. It's unfair to current and future citizens of Ohio.
