My name is Kathleen Tate and I live at 317 Northern Spy Circle in Howard Ohio. I am here today because I am opposed to Bill HJR1.

I was born, raised and graduated from high school here in Ohio. After High School, I followed President Kennedy's advice and asked not what my country could do for me but asked what I could do for my country so I served in the Air Force. Service and fairness for are what I stand for. I am opposed to this bill because it goes against that.

This bill is unfair to voters. One person one vote expresses the principle of equal representation in voting. That means each vote is valued the same. What this bill does is give greater value to minority votes than to the majority ones.
