## RE: HB 315 (TOWNSHIP OMNIBUS BILL) – NEW COMMUNITY AUTHORITIES (NCA)

Chairman Edwards, Vice Chairman LaRae, Ranking Member Sweeney, and Honorable members of the House Finance Committee:

Union Township, Clermont County, Ohio would like to offer its support of HB 315, the Township Omnibus Bill, specifically regarding the inclusion of a provision included in the original version of the bill that would allow large urban townships that have adopted limited home rule with the authority to form a New Community Authority (NCA). As a limited home rule Township with a population that now exceeds 50,000 residents, Union Township supports legislation that would expand the ability of the Township to create NCAs in an efficient manner, as to enhance the efficiency of local government.

Union Township seeks to engage in the robust and professional delivery of core services to the more than 50,000 residents and countless businesses that choose to locate here, because the structure of Township Government is both nimble and efficient.
