

Chairman Cutrona, Vice Chair Gross, Ranking Member Somani, and members of the Health Provider Services Committee, thank you for allowing me to provide support testimony for HB 319; “The Conscientious Right to Refuse Act.”

“Have no other Gods” is a staple of my faith. The idea that we’re now groveling for a right that we already have written federally, but some legislators who are medical experts fail to inform their constituents of is odd.

The corporate level of some medical facilities have appeared to be violating the Establishment Clause for some time by discriminating through coerced vaccination as criteria for employment, and as a religious moral test. The people didn’t understand their rights, evidenced by countless people I observed taking flu shots who didn’t want to. They feared termination. I didn’t understand mine when it was declared by professors that I “must” take a harmful MMR vaccine in order to participate in my profession. I tried and tried to say no. I got really sick. Wasn’t sure if I’d live. But more devastating was that I committed adultery in my faith with God. God has strengthened me in mind and body since, however. I full well knew I didn’t want/need that shot, but the “institution” was convincing me I didn’t have that conscientious right to say no, and I caved in. That was then. I now stand more firmly on my faith. Hence, I write religious exemptions just to participate in a career I spent 10 years in after going to

school for. I've said no to flu shots always, while the staff who say yes shared their upper respiratory issues after taking theirs, told by management to "not" call it the flu. It is preposterous and horrid that individuals like myself who suffer vaccine injuries, who are incredibly healthy must be medically pimped in this fashion, and I want the legislature to know that I view this as medical trafficking. Needless to say I am proudly not vaccinated against COVID-19 and my current employer supports my decision.

The same people who tell you a woman's right is to say no sexually are telling women they don't have the right to say no to a needle that penetrates the skin if they want to have a job. That's just wrong. This isn't complicated.

This is from a past patient, and I quote: "The only thing keeping me above the threshold of suicide is seeing my family. And now they've taken that away." She was hemiplegic, crying, with muffled speech. I'll never forget this woman. She was in "isolation." The facility mandated she be isolated, separated, like torture victims are. I was fired from a job for wanting to confront this ethical dilemma of facilitating isolation, which was defined as abuse by CMS when it caused mental anguish. The gaslighting needs to stop. Obligating us to report abuse, then losing a job for doing so is gaslighting.

The 5th Tenant of Satanism seems to credit "science" as an ultimate authority on truth and fact. Is the government

pushing Satanism on the people by crediting a vaccine or medical interventions as life giver, saver? Establishment Clause violation?

Is the precious science we're being forced to idolize as our life giver, sustainer and saver, flawed by omission of VAERS data? What's not included in the data is equally important in this discussion, and we all saw how the honorable Dr. Tenpenny was targeted, mocked and lied about.

Ohioans deserve the rights to opt out of a forced religious medical belief that requires their bodies be used as rituals of medical experimentation as criteria to hold a job or participate in society. I urge you to hear my words, and please vote yes on HB 319.
