Re: Support Letter and Proponent Testimony for House Bill 248

Dear Chairman Ghanbari,

On behalf of the Ohio Suicide Prevention Foundation (OSPF), I am writing to express my enthusiastic support for House Bill 248, the proposed legislation that would establish a new license plate dedicated to raising awareness for suicide prevention in Ohio. As the Executive Director of OSPF, I believe that this initiative will play a crucial role in promoting mental health awareness and supporting the important work of the Ohio Suicide Prevention Foundation and our many partners throughout Ohio. Our mission is to work towards ensuring not one additional life is lost.

The staggering statistics related to suicide rates underscore the urgent need for comprehensive and proactive measures to address mental health issues in our state:

- Suicide impacts all communities across Ohio: in fact, our state loses 5 people a day to suicide.
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death for ages 10-24 and the leading cause of death for ages 10-14.
- Over 80% of Ohio's suicides are 35-65-year-old adults, and the highest rate of suicide lies with people over the age of 75.
- In July 2022, 988, the new National Suicide Crisis Lifeline went live across the state on average Ohio is seeing an average of 10,000 calls, chats, and texts a month to 988.

OSPF has been working with the McClintock family from Tallmadge on introducing this license plate. In 2012, Debbie McClintock tragically lost her husband to suicide. Then, a few months later, her son, Logan, lost his life to suicide. By introducing a specialized license plate, we have the opportunity to bring attention to this critical issue on a daily basis, fostering public discourse and reducing the stigma associated with mental health challenges. We hope no situation like the McClintock family has faced will ever happen to another Ohio family.

This will have the potential to make a significant impact on the mental well-being of our community members. By approving the establishment of suicide prevention license plates in Ohio, we can collectively contribute to breaking down the barriers surrounding mental health, fostering a culture of empathy, and ultimately saving lives.
