I am one of the many parents across the state who have joined the grassroots movement to bring LifeWise Academy to our local school districts. Our small rural community no longer has a religious private school option. Consequently, we have seen a decline in student behavior and mental health. As a substitute teacher in the public school, I see first hand this decline and the need for moral and character development. As a result, I volunteered many hours last summer helping bring LifeWise Academy to our district.

Our local board worked with the school district to allow release time education to occur weekly during grade level teacher planning time.
