## Opponent Testimony for H.B. 445 Primary and Secondary Education Committee November 12, 2024

Dear Representative Gale Manning:

I am testifying in opposition to House Bill 445 and to urge you to vote NO on this bill. My name is Brittany Hulbert. I am a parent living in central Ohio, a product of Ohio's public schools, and a graduate of The Ohio State University. As a dedicated advocate for education, both for my family and for all Ohio children, I believe H.B. 445 threatens the quality and autonomy of our state's public education system.

It is in the best interest of our students to uphold the current legislation, which protects local governance. School districts should retain the freedom to decide for themselves whether to allow Release Time for Religious Instruction (RTRI) based on their unique community needs and values. H.B. 445 would take away that local choice, imposing a one-size-fits-all mandate across the state.

Mandating an RTRI policy for all school districts disregards each district's unique needs and disrupts the educational environment. For Ohio to continue thriving as a leader in workforce innovation and economic stability, public education must remain strong and undisturbed. Requiring districts to accommodate non-educational, third-party organizations during school hours undermines our schools' focus and threatens the quality of education that is essential to Ohio's future success.

The existing law on this matter honors the independence of our districts and minimizes unnecessary state interference. By voting "no" on H.B. 445, you will be supporting local control and allowing communities to make their own decisions based on what's best for them. I strongly urge you to support Ohio's school districts and freedom by voting "no" on H.B. 445.
