Dear Committee Chair Manning & members of the House Primary and Secondary Education Committee,

Thank you for the opportunity to express my thoughts on HB 445. I am a resident of Bath Township near Akron, OH. Prior to living in Bath, I lived for many years in Firestone Park in Akron, OH. As such, I have provided direct support to both Akron City Schools and Revere Schools in the form of property taxes and indirectly in the form of state and local income taxes. I am now retired but worked for 40+ years as an IT professional in both manufacturing and health care.

I am writing to express opposition to the change contained in HB 445 which would <u>mandate</u> that Ohio school districts adopt a policy authorizing students to be excused from school to attend a released time course in religious instruction.
