Please provide a brief statement on your position: Dear Chair Manning, Vice Chair Arthur, Ranking Member Fowler and members of the Primary and Secondary Education Committee. Thank you for considering this testimony provided in opposition to HB 445.

Religion and religious instruction is important to many families in Ohio. This does not mean that this instruction should happen during the public school day. Programs like Lifwise that are only (by design) offfered during the school day are disruptive to families who do not choose to enroll their children in such a program. I have tried to understand the argument that these programs can only be successful if they happen during the school day, but that makes no sense at all to me.

Each individual school district is currently permitted to evaluate for themselves whether the environment in their community can withstand this disruption, or whether it puts too great a stress on teachers, staff, and the full student population. Several school districts have initially allowed this program to trial in the community and found that they had to withdraw the position because the burden on the full school community was too great. The bill being proposed would take the autonomy away from individual school districts to make these decisions and mandate that programs such as Lifewise be allowed. For some districts, this might compromise The ability of individual districts to provide a first rate public education to their enrolled students.

For these reasons, I am opposed to HB 445 and I urge the members of the committee to reject this bill.
