Chairman Lipps, Vice Chair Stewart, Ranking Member Liston, and members of the House Public Health Policy Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide sponsor testimony on House Joint Resolution 4.

As a legislative body, it is vital that we protect the liberties of our citizens and allow them to have a voice in the laws and societal norms that govern them on a day to day basis. Many Representatives have heard from Ohioans across the state asking for the freedom to choose whether or not they wear facial coverings in public places. During the last crisis, many witnessed the unsanitary handling and disposal of these devices that directly affected your respiratory system – whether stuffed in bags for multiple uses or being handed to clients by untrained employees to the casual reach in the communal mask bag and grab one for yourself in order to access a public location. Many of us witnessed the discrimination against individuals that had health conditions preventing them from wearing masks in public locations segregating them from society.

A great number of our constituents wanted their children to be able to attend school, without having their face covered, and their ability to learn stunted. Their calls to us for choice on the issue of masking were not acted upon. This joint resolution will finally give citizens of our state a voice on the issue of mandatory face coverings in places of public accommodation, where public services are rendered, including our public and private schools. HJR4 will give Ohioans the opportunity to vote for the right for themselves and their children to breathe freely while participating in activities like school, shopping and interaction with government services to be a state constitutional right.

Our legislative body was unable to provide for protections for Ohioans who wanted to participate freely in commerce and education activities without being forced into a facial covering. We now have an opportunity to right that wrong, by allowing them

the chance to vote for themselves on their right to be unmasked during any future crisis.
