Our tripartite mission to provide lifesaving clinical care, generate innovative research, and educate the next generations of medical providers all underscore our goal to improve the comprehensive care of trauma patients in the greater Cincinnati region. We are innovators, relentless in our pursuit of the best in medicine and able to care for the most complex and critically ill patients. We hold the highest standard of patient care, clinical research and medical education.

Workplace violence in the healthcare setting is a significant and growing concern that has reached epidemic status. Healthcare workers are four times more likely to experience workplace violence than workers in other industries and these incidents range from verbal abuse to acts of physical violence and they can have severe consequences not only for the victims but also for the overall healthcare environment. We applaud the efforts of the sponsors to address workplace violence in healthcare for the State of Ohio. We believe at a time when recruitment and retention of healthcare professionals is experiencing significant challenges, addressing workplace violence could help improve healthcare professional satisfaction. Healthcare professionals are the backbone of our healthcare system, and they deserve a safe and secure work environment where they can focus on their primary mission: delivering exceptional patient care. By enacting House Bill 452, we take a decisive step towards protecting our healthcare workers, ensuring their well-being, and ultimately improving patient outcomes.
