Chair Mathews, Vice Chair Stewart, Ranking Member Liston, and members of the Public Health Policy Committee, thank you for the opportunity to provide Sponsor Testimony for H.B. 602.

As I am sure many of you know, I am a big believer in educational choice for families. The opportunities for education today are vast and we here in this body should continue to allow for paths that create the best outcomes for children on their educational journey.

As Representative Fowler-Arthur mentioned, learning pods have been increasingly popular among parents for education. 2020 and the mass school shutdowns forced parents to consider alternative learning options for their children, some parents had been doing so for a long time.
