Referral Report

May 23, 2023

Representative Russo reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

H. B. No. 167 – Representatives Miranda, Abrams

To modify the requirements for chief of police training and to allow advanced training for officers at or above the rank of sergeant and to amend the version of section 109.804 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect December 29, 2023, to continue the change on and after that date.

To the committee on Homeland Security

H. B. No. 168 – Representatives Callender, Weinstein

To enact the Ohio Adult Use Act and to levy a tax.

To the committee on Finance

H. B. No. 169 – Representative Hillyer

To prohibit the provision of sun lamp tanning services to individuals under age 18 and to make changes regarding the titles that may be used by physicians.

To the committee on Health Provider Services

H. B. No. 170 – Representatives Grim, Thomas, C.

To enact the Extreme Risk Protection Order Act to allow family members, household members, and law enforcement officers to obtain a court order that temporarily restricts a person's access to firearms if that person poses a danger to themselves or others.

H. B. No. 171 – Representative Lightbody

To include instruction on the migration, experiences, and contributions of a range of communities in the social studies model curriculum.

H. B. No. 172 – Representative Swearingen

To expand the laws on wills, declarations or living wills, durable powers of attorney for health care, powers of attorney, and transfer on death designation affidavits by providing for their execution electronically.

To designate the month of May as "Older Ohioans Month."

To the committee on Families and Aging

H. B. No. 174 – Representatives Skindell, Grim

To establish and operate the Ohio Health Care Plan to provide universal health care coverage to all Ohio residents.

H. B. No. 175 – Representatives Miranda, Brewer

To require secure storage of firearms, to authorize an income tax credit for the purchase of firearm storage and locking devices, to name this act the Keep Every Home Safe Act, and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 176 – Representative Grim

To revise the "Ohio Carpenters" license plate.

To the committee on Homeland Security

H. B. No. 177 – Representative Manchester

To prohibit certain health insurance cost-sharing practices.

To the committee on Insurance

H. B. No. 178 – Representatives Brent, Callender

To enact the Creating a Respectful and Open World for Natural Hair (CROWN) Act to prohibit discrimination against an individual based on hair texture and protective hair styles.

To the committee on Civil Justice

H. B. No. 179 – Representatives Mathews, Stewart

Relative to vicarious liability in tort actions and to provide that the tolling of the limitations period during the defendant's absence or concealment does not apply to statutes of repose.

H. B. No. 180 – Representatives LaRe, Swearingen

To prohibit a municipal corporation or charter county from imposing a curfew except in certain cases.

To make various changes regarding recorded instruments, powers of attorney, judgment liens, mortgage subrogation, law enforcement towing laws, and state stock banks, and to make an appropriation.

Regarding environmental, social, and corporate governance policies with respect to the state retirement systems, Bureau of Workers' Compensation, and state institutions of higher education.

To designate April as "Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month" and July as "Sarcoma Awareness Month" and to name certain provisions of the act as Hank's Law.

To lower the minimum age for an original appointment as a police officer from twenty-one to eighteen years of age.

To enact the Data Analysis Transparency Archive (DATA) Act to establish the Office of Data Analytics and Archives in the Office of the Secretary of State and to modify requirements for the Statewide Voter Registration Database and other election records.

To enact the Ohio Higher Education Enhancement Act regarding the operation of state institutions of higher education and to revise the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act.
