### **Referral Report**

**September 12, 2023**

Representative Russo reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills, House Joint Resolution, and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 223 – Representative Thomas, J.**

To create the "Jackson Local Schools" license plate.

**To the committee on Homeland Security**

**H. B. No. 224 – Representatives Miller, J., Lightbody**

To allow a dedicated organ recovery vehicle to use a flashing light and siren, to prohibit failing to stop for, yield to, or proceed with caution around such vehicles, and to exempt the driver of a dedicated organ recovery vehicle from certain traffic laws.

To designate the month of June as "Pride Month."
