### **Referral Report**

**February 6, 2024**

Representative Russo reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bill be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 373 – Representatives Wiggam, Stewart**

To authorize a clerk of court to conduct the required physical inspection of a motor vehicle in specified circumstances.

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 374 – Representatives Mohamed, Dobos**

To clarify that certain nonresident drivers with valid international drivers licenses may drive in Ohio.

**To the committee on Homeland Security**

**H. B. No. 375 – Representatives Demetriou, Patton**

To make changes to the law relating to tax foreclosures and county land reutilization corporations.

**To the committee on Economic and Workforce Development**

**H. B. No. 376 – Representatives Grim, McNally**

To require vloggers to hold in a trust account a portion of compensation earned from any content featuring minors and to name this act the Kidfluencer Protection Act.

**To the committee on Civil Justice**

**H. B. No. 377 – Representatives Williams, Santucci**

To enact the Human Trafficking Prevention Act to increase the penalty for human trafficking of a minor or person with a developmental disability, kidnapping, and abduction.

To authorize a full homestead exemption for surviving spouses of members of the uniformed services killed in the line of duty.

To establish procedures for microchip scanning of deceased dogs or cats found on a public road or highway.

**H. B. No. 383 – Representative Fowler Arthur**

To designate a portion of U.S. Route 20 in Ashtabula County as the "Corporal John E. Ruch Memorial Highway."

To cap cost sharing for prescription insulin drugs and diabetes devices.

To allow a victim of human trafficking to expunge certain criminal records.

To phase-out the state income tax on nonbusiness income over six years and to repeal the commercial activity tax after 2029.

**H. B. No. 387 – Representatives McNally, Brent**

To dissolve existing academic distress commissions, to repeal the law that creates new commissions, and to declare an emergency.

**To the committee on Primary and Secondary Education**

**H. B. No. 388 – Representatives Baker, White**

To authorize the Director of Health to enter into agreements with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the administration and enforcement of the federal Renovation, Repair, and Painting Rule.

**H. B. No. 389 – Representatives Lorenz, Gross**

To designate the eleventh day of September as "9/11 Remembrance Day."

**To the committee on State and Local Government**

**H. B. No. 390 – Representatives Brown, Swearingen**

To revise the law relating to the notice of excess funds in real property foreclosure sales.

**To the committee on Civil Justice**

**H. B. No. 391 – Representatives Wiggam, Lipps**

To make changes to the laws governing accessible parking.

**To the committee on Government Oversight**

**H. B. No. 392 – Representatives Stewart, Plummer**

To add nitrogen hypoxia as a method of execution and to prohibit the disclosure of execution identifying information.

**H. B. No. 393 – Representative Baker**

To require refunds for utility customers when a utility charge was determined to be unlawful.

**H. B. No. 394 – Representative Holmes**

To prohibit state institutions of higher education from requiring individuals to commit to specific beliefs, affiliations, ideals, or principles.

**H. B. No. 395 – Representatives Lorenz, Brewer**

To lower the age at which a juvenile may obtain a temporary instruction permit, to require defensive driver training as a prerequisite to receiving a driver's license, to alter the penalties for certain first-time juvenile traffic offenders, and to authorize an income tax credit for younger drivers who voluntarily take a defensive driving course.

**To the committee on Homeland Security**

**H. B. No. 396 – Representatives Brennan, Williams**

To provide funding for the replacement of police dogs imprinted to detect marijuana, to reimburse those expenses from adult use excise tax revenue, and to make an appropriation.

**To the committee on Finance**

**H. B. No. 397 – Representatives Hoops, Baker**

To increase education, awareness, and understanding of cognitive impairment, Alzheimer's disease, and other types of dementia.

**To the committee on Public Health Policy**

**H. B. No. 398 – Representatives Miranda, Abdullahi**

To prohibit employers from seeking a prospective employee's wage or salary history.

**To the committee on Commerce and Labor**

**H. B. No. 399 – Representatives Brown, Lampton**

To modify the existing income tax credit for organ donors and to create an income tax credit for employers that provide paid leave to organ donors.
