Referral Report

April 30, 2024

Representative Jarrells reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

H. B. No. 496 – Representative Hoops

To revise the law governing property taxes and county auditors.

To the committee on Ways and Means

H. B. No. 497 – Representatives Stewart, Klopfenstein

To make various changes regarding county law and to amend the version of section 153.39 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2025, to continue the change on and after that date.

To the committee on State and Local Government

H. B. No. 498 – Representative Carruthers

To remove the criminal offense related to donating blood when the donor is a carrier of the virus that causes AIDS.

To the committee on Criminal Justice

H. B. No. 499 – Representatives Isaacsohn, Mathews

To create grant programs for housing developments near megaprojects and for townships and municipalities that adopt pro-housing policies, to modify the community reinvestment area law relating to residential property, and to limit the 10% nonbusiness property tax credit.

To the committee on Government Oversight

H. B. No. 500 – Representatives Carruthers, Upchurch

To prohibit unauthorized displays of symbols on bridges or highways and unauthorized projections of images onto buildings and to expand the offenses of aggravated trespass and ethnic intimidation.

H. B. No. 501 – Representative Carruthers

To create the Joint Legislative Study Committee on Small Business Retirement Options to study and report on private sector retirement plans and state-facilitated retirement savings options to improve access to retirement programs.

To protect assisted reproduction care.

To the committee on Public Health Policy

H. B. No. 503 – Representatives Peterson, Jones

To prohibit certain activities regarding garbage-fed swine, feral swine, and wild boar.

To the committee on Agriculture

H. B. No. 504 – Representative Pavliga

To require alcohol server training and to provide immunity from civil liability to those who successfully complete and implement the training and to name this act Hayden's Law.

To the committee on Civil Justice

H. B. No. 505 – Representatives Barhorst, Stewart

Regarding insurer and Medicaid program accreditation requirements for pharmacies, to impose drug cost reporting and payment requirements on pharmacy benefit managers, and to name this act the Community Pharmacy Protection Act.

H. B. No. 506 – Representative Jarrells

Regarding school policies on the administration of overdose reversal drugs.

To the committee on Primary and Secondary Education

H. B. No. 507 – Representative Hillyer

To extend legal safe harbor to political subdivisions that implement a specified cybersecurity program.
