### **Referral Report**

**June 11, 2024**

Representative Russo reported for the Rules and Reference committee recommending that the following House Bills and Senate Bills be considered for the second time and referred to the following committees for consideration:

**H. B. No. 610 – Representative Johnson**

To establish the Child Care Cred Program and to make an appropriation.

**To the committee on Finance**

**H. B. No. 611 – Representative Ghanbari**

To designate a portion of State Route 199 in Wood County as the "U.S. Army Private First Class Jerry Bockbrader Memorial Highway."

**To the committee on Transportation**

**H. B. No. 612 – Representative Forhan**

To require state officers and employees to complete annual training on engaging with individuals who are neurodivergent.

**To the committee on Government Oversight**

**H. B. No. 613 – Representative Forhan**

To require the House of Representatives to contract with an independent third party to biannually conduct an audit of the House of Representatives' human resources practices.

**H. B. No. 614 – Representative Forhan**

To require the Capitol Square Review and Advisory Board to examine the Statehouse in Columbus to identify symbols that resemble the swastika, to proceed with renovations necessary to remove the identified symbols, and to name this act the Statehouse Nazi Symbol Removal Act.

To require each board of public library trustees to adopt a policy that prohibits its libraries from displaying matter harmful to juveniles and to redistribute the public library funds of libraries that fail to do so.

And to amend Section 733.61 of H.B. 166 of the 133rd General Assembly, as subsequently amended, to codify it as section 3313.6031 of the Revised Code to require school districts to offer at least one high school computer science course and to amend the version of section 3314.03 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2025, to continue the changes on and after that effective date.
