Chair McClain, Vice Chair Dobos, Ranking Member Grim, and members of the Transportation Committee, today, I stand before you to speak about a young man whose service to our country left an indelible mark on his community, his family, and all who knew him—Sgt. Anthony M. K. Vinnedge.

Through House Bill 674, we will dedicate a part of our highway system to this distinguished gentleman, ensuring that his sacrifice will be remembered by everyone who passes through this area. This small gesture is but a fraction of the legacy he has left behind—a legacy that will continue to inspire and serve as a reminder of the selflessness of those who answer the call to serve.

Tony Vinnedge's story is one of tradition, service, and sacrifice. Born in Okeana, Ohio, he was the son of Deborah Kress Vinnedge and Michael Vinnedge. But Tony's connection to this community goes even deeper. His family has called this area home since the 1930s, and it's where Tony grew up, creating memories on the family's 90+ acre farm. It is in this very community that he learned the values of hard work, dedication, and commitment that would later define his military service.

Tony's story of service began long before he joined the Army in 2002. His grandfather, a proud Army veteran of the Korean War, set a remarkable example for Tony. In 1952, his grandfather joined the Army, and fifty years later, Tony followed in his footsteps. It was a fitting tribute to the family's long-standing tradition of military service.

Tony enlisted in the Army in 2002, and for three years, he served with distinction on active duty. But his sense of duty did not end there. After completing his active duty service, Tony joined the Ohio National Guard as a Patriot Missile battery operator, where he served for an additional two years. During his time with the Guard, he was deployed twice to Iraq, the last of which was with the 2nd Squadron, 107th Cavalry, based out of the Armory on Symmes Road in Fairfield and Greenville, Ohio. It was here, in these communities, that Tony spent much of his life and where he created some of his fondest memories.

On July 5th, 2006, Tony made the ultimate sacrifice while serving in the Radwaniyah Palace Complex in Iraq. Though his passing was not the result of enemy action, his commitment to his country was unquestionable, and the cost of his service is something we can never take for granted. Tony gave his life so that others might have the freedom to live theirs, and for that, we
