Ingram, my name is Kashi Adhikari and I represent The Nepali Vedic Welfare Society of Ohio. I am here to testify in support of SB49.

This bill is important to my community as it impacts the children and the parents in religious ways. I appreciate that the bill will permit students to be absent up to three days for religious and spiritual reasons. This would go in line with religious freedom. In the event of a father's or mother's death, students will remain absent for thirteen days as part of the Hindu cultural norms.

This bill will allow students to freely practice their religion without the state interference. It will also ensure students will not be penalized for missing class, examinations, and other class work. Students will freely celebrate and enjoy their religious freedom without fear of penalization for missing classes.

I believe that school districts are required to provide an opportunity for students to make up any missed examinations or academic work when they are absent for attending religious ceremonies.
