Chair Brenner, Vice Chair O'Brien, Ranking Member Ingram, and members of the Senate Education Committee,

Thank you for allowing me to testify today. My name is Leslie Dybiec. I am a lifetime resident of Ohio and an advocate for high quality public education. I am strongly opposed to SB 293 and its House counterpart HB 445.

The choice to attend a non-public school already exists. If parents want their child to have access to religious education during their school day, it is available to them.

Roughly 80 percent of Ohio students attend traditional public school districts, while more than 110,000 students attend charter schools and more than 200,000 students attend non-public schools or homeschool.

Public school education was not intended to serve as religious education. The US Constitution is supposed to ensure a separation of church and state. Therefore, dedicating time to religious practice, at Ohio taxpayer's expense, and at the expense of teaching Ohio's curriculum, has no place in public schools.
