Even though ESAs do not fund the schools themselves, they empower me, as a parent, with more options of where to send my children.

The freedom to choose allows American families to preserve educational diversity, supporting a range of methodologies without overwhelming regulations that do not contribute to the effectiveness of a school. Nonchartered schools are more personal to the students, by offering smaller class sizes, which in turn offers more individualized attention. These elements are significant in helping my daughter thrive academically and socially. I love that my duaghter's nonchartered school can provide excellent preparation for both college and life, giving the students the tools they need to succeed. Sadly, without financial help, innumerable amounts of children will not be given the same opportunity.

One last significant point is that the competition created by school choice helps drive all schools, whether public or private, to improve. When schools are held accountable by parent choice, they are motivated to perform better, ensuring that every child receives a high-quality education. Sadly, the American public education system is currently showing a steady, significant decline in academic performance and test results, when compared to other first-world countries. Competition and empowering parents with various school choice options is absolutely critical.

In conclusion, I strongly believe that expanding school choice through programs like ESAs will create a more competitive, effective, and inclusive educational system. It is a step toward
