## **Testimony by TRAVIS IRVINE on Senate Bill 247**

## Senate Energy and Public Utilities Committee December 3, 2023

Chairman Reineke, Vice-Chair McColley, Ranking Member Smith and members of the Senate Energy and Public Utilities Committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit proponent testimony on Senate Bill 247 (SB 247), a bill to establish a framework for the Community Solar Pilot Program (CSPP) and encourage community solar facility development in Ohio. My name is Travis Irvine and I am the current Communications Director with the Libertarian Party of Ohio as well as a former candidate for Governor, meaning I'm proud to join this *multi*-partisan effort to make community solar a reality here in The Buckeye State. And as a Libertarian, I appreciate how SB 247 makes decentralization a larger aspect of Ohio's competitive energy market, a true win-win-win for all Ohioans. In fact, from what I understand, the ONLY opposition to SB 247 comes from the same old big energy companies who are anti-competition and have a history of seeking big government bailouts — paid for by ratepayers and taxpayers alike — whenever *they* can't seem to understand the trajectory of the free market and make poor business decisions. No matter how many campaign donations — or bribes — they give to some members of this esteemed body, they can't stop the free market principles that are enshrined in SB 247 from eventually happening. And *now* is the time to make them happen.
