Committee on Financial Institutions and Technology Minutes
June 6, 2023
135th General Assembly

The Senate Committee on Financial Institutions and Technology was called to order pursuant to the meeting notice at approximately 9:30 a.m. in the South Hearing Room of the State House.

Attendance was taken and a quorum was present.

The Chair called up Senate Bill 50 (Wilson, Smith) for its eighth hearing.
