Through issue 38, Cleveland voters are now presented with an opportunity to directly and meaningfully guide how a portion of their public budget is spent. Whether they wish to pursue this opportunity should be the decision of Cleveland voters, and Cleveland voters alone. The state of Ohio should not preempt this decision.

The process of participatory budgeting has been used in hundreds of cities across the United States as a form of civic education and engagement, and as a meaningful mechanism for city residents to work with elected officials and city administrations to determine how their taxpayer dollars are spent

Whether one is in favor of or opposed to Cleveland issue 38, Cleveland voters should be the ones to decide if this process is right for Cleveland.
