
I believe that we have a right to have different medical options presented to us and a right to choose which option is best suited to our needs. A doctor should not have to choose between him losing his license if he doesn't follow an entity that has no clue to our physical history, or to do to the best of his/her ability to give us choices, whether they be what is normally prescribed or off label medications. Medications, vaccines, and shots are not a one size fits all. People react differently to each of those mentioned. To FORCE by threatening they would lose their jobs or not having lifesaving surgeries upon someone to take something that we have no clue how they would react to it nor know enough about it to know the consequences of it to our bodies to me is a crime against humanity.
