Dear Chairman Huffman, Vice Chair Johnson and Members of the Senate Health Committee. Thank you for hearing my support testimony for HB236 The "Never Alone Act"

It is with great sadness that I must share this testimony as I believed that this would have been passed out of the senate by now after the unspeakable atrocities that have occurred under this State of Ohio Government and the medical establishment against Ohio citizens.

My name is Melanie Leneghan. I am a lifelong freedom loving Ohio patriot. Both of my parents who are lifelong Ohio patriots raised me in Youngstown, Ohio to love our country. My father Bill loved this country and was in the naval reserve on active duty when we pulled out of Cuba.

My father was the center of my world and my greatest source of wisdom. He loved our country and Jesus. He taught me to serve our country and I have. I was an elected official for eight years, I have donated well into the six figures to conservative causes and Republican candidates, I even ran for Congress and now am thankful to sit in one of the 66 seats at the Ohio Republican Party. My point is that I understand service, our government and the good, the bad and the ugly of our government

My father was falsely ( in my opinion ) diagnosed with Covid in 2020. The medical tyrants here in Ohio claimed he still had covid when they killed him four weeks later.

My father was robbed of every freedom he had fought for. He wanted out of the hospital as praying with his two children on a laptop was killing him and he knew that it was killing us. I will not go into the details of how the medical establishment killed my father as I suffer from PTSD as a result of my suffering and the evil that he had to endure.

In spite of his surgeon reaching out to me as the only doctor on staff at the hospital who knew my dad, telling me that he needed to get out of the hospital environment as it was killing him and "very bad" for him and me going to Youngstown and meeting with the hospital leadership ( six of them ) in a conference room with the surgeon, they refused to let him out. I secured a rental home and promised to provide all medical equipment they saw fit and a nurse. In spite of that they REFUSED to release my father. I then retained a lawyer and we began the fight to get him out. We expedited the court case. They stepped up their killing procedures and saw fit that my father was dead the day before court. I was in Youngstown when they notified us that he was in ICU and they were going to intubate him as he was dying??? I begged to come in and be with him. They refused me access to my dying father and told me that the nurse who he didn't know who was in a space suit would tell him that I was thinking of him. The additional horrors of my experience and atrocities against my father at the hand of the medical establishment are too painful for me to type out and cause me to go into hysterical crying fits. For the love of all that is good and for the love of freedom and the representative republic it is incumbent upon you to take a vote and pass this bill.

This is not the time to sit on this life saving bill. It's a matter of life and death for the ill and their families.

I urge you to honor freedom and the Constitutional Republic by first voting on and voting YES on HB 236.
