

Senator Steve Huffman 5th District Senate Judiciary Committee May 22, 2024 Senate Bill 241

Chair Manning, Vice Chair Reynolds, Ranking Member Hicks-Hudson, and fellow members of the Senate Judiciary Committee, I am grateful to provide sponsor testimony today on Senate Bill 241.

Senate Bill 241 creates a shortened process for removing unauthorized persons known as "squatters" from residential properties in Ohio. Squatting usually occurs when an individual stays at a property that is not owned by them while claiming a right to the property. This can often be seen when individuals are providing forged leases to authorities and property owners. The legal process for the removal of these "squatters" can oftentimes be contentious and costly for property owners.

Senate Bill 241 will create a new process for a property owner or their authorized agent to file a verified complaint with the sheriff in the county in which the property is located for the immediate removal of such unauthorized persons. This bill would designate that unlawfully detaining or trespassing upon a residential dwelling and intentionally causing at least \$1,000 in damage to such dwelling is a second-degree felony.

Lastly, this bill outlines that providing a false document purporting to be a valid lease or deed is a first degree misdemeanor, and that fraudulently listing for sale or renting or leasing residential property without possessing an ownership right to or leasehold interest in the property is a first-degree felony.
