HB 101 Written-Only Testimony

Chair O'Brien, Vice Chair Gavarone, Ranking Member DeMora and members of the Senate Local Government Committee thank you very much for the opportunity to provide written-only testimony on HB 101 which provides updates on village dissolution laws. I am Bryan Long and I am fortunate to serve as the Licking County Recorder and as the Chairman of the Ohio Recorders' Association (ORA) Legislative Committee.

The Ohio Recorders' Association appreciates the efforts of Representative Adam Bird and Representative Jean Schmidt to update and provide greater clarity in statute in village dissolution situations. Additionally, the ORA is supportive of the language including the County Recorder in the Transition Supervisory Board.

Through the committee process the House added an amendment at the request of the Ohio Recorders' Association to the legislation which allows the lot numbers previously assigned to a tract, parcel, or lot of land to continue to be used after a dissolution. This important amendment provides a mechanism to avoid potential issues such as requiring new metes and bounds surveys for legal descriptions or issues with chain of title if the previous lot numbers were no longer permitted to exist.

With the House passed version addressing the concerns identified by our Association, the ORA is a proponent of HB 101. Please do not hesitate to contact me if there are any questions related to the legislations impact to the role of County Recorders.
