People cannot survive on this pay and end up leaving the field due to better paying jobs. This limits staffing, which limits the availability for our families. We are forced to accept reduced hours of care due to staffing. These individuals are human beings. Every one of them deserves to receive the care to meet their needs. Most are not given this opportunity. Its unfair to the individuals, their families, staff that won't be able to survive on the pay even though they are willing to give the care to these individuals.
