Ways and Means Committee Senate Bill 271 Sponsor Testimony Senator Hearcel F. Craig Senator Louis Blessing III June 12, 2024

Good afternoon Chair Blessing, Vice-Chair Roegner, Ranking Member Smith and members of the Ways and Means Committee. Thank you for the opportunity to testify today in support of Senate Bill 271. This crucial piece of legislation aims to provide much-needed financial relief to our fellow Ohioans through a refundable income tax credit or rebate for homeowners and renters. Specifically, this bill targets those whose property taxes or a portion of their rent exceed five percent of their income.
