The GOSA is a non-profit organization made up of 450+ members in the outdoor amusement industry. Our members service all the county fairs in the state of Ohio as well as other festivals and community events. GOSA members are family owned & operated businesses and earn their living providing enjoyment to others.

As you have heard from businesses across the state, finding employees is a growing struggle. Our industry has those same hardships recruiting and retaining employees. Many of our members employ students to work in their businesses. It is a great opportunity for students to get work experience, earn money for college, or save to buy a car. We have found these students to be wonderful additions to our teams.

While our businesses are largely seasonal, we do have festivals, fairs and other events that happen during the school year. This is especially true as we see most classes start well before the traditional end of summer, Labor Day. Under SB 30, our student employees could continue to earn money working during the evening, with their parents' approval. This not only helps Ohio's students continue to get real world work experience but opens additional opportunities for them to earn their own money. It can also help ease the strain of finding and hiring reliable staff if we are able to continue employing those students who have already proven themselves to be valuable and trusted team members.

We thank Senator Schaffer for reintroducing this legislation, and we hope for favorable passage.
