INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 328 - Representatives Roemer, Plummer.

To amend sections 2913.02, 2913.51, 4737.012, 4737.04, 4737.041, 4737.045, 4737.09, 4738.03, 4738.07, 4738.12, 4745.01, and 4775.09 and to enact sections 4737.046, 4737.20, 4737.21, 4737.22, 4737.23, 4737.24, 4737.25, and 4737.98 of the Revised Code regarding the sale of used catalytic converters, and to make an appropriation.

H. B. No. 329 - Representative Pavliga.

To enact section 109.7411 of the Revised Code to require the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission to develop training materials on the subject of sextortion and provide those materials to law enforcement agencies.

H. B. No. 330 - Representatives Lear, John.

To enact section 5534.914 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 13 in Knox County as the "William 'Bill' Burgett Memorial Highway."
