The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Pursuant to House Rule No. 23, the Clerk called the House to order.

Representative Edwards was selected to preside under the Rule.

The journal of the previous legislative day was read and approved.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 269 - Representative Holmes.

To enact section 5534.847 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 60 in Muskingum County as the "Sgt Bradley J. Harper USMC Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 270 - Representatives Young, T., Mathews. Cosponsors: Representatives Brennan, Johnson, Miller, K., Richardson, Stoltzfus, Williams, Willis.

To amend section 2929.18 and to enact section 2125.05 of the Revised Code to require a felony offender of an OVI-caused aggravated vehicular homicide to pay child maintenance when the victim is a parent, legal guardian, or custodian of a minor child, to allow child maintenance to be awarded in a wrongful death action when the offender is deceased, and to name this act the Sam Knisley Family Support Act.

H. B. No. 271 - Representatives Mathews, Peterson.

To amend section 3505.06 of the Revised Code to specify that state questions and issues appearing on ballots must be numbered consecutively based on the previous election.

H. B. No. 272 - Representatives Mathews, Pizzulli.

To amend section 2923.123 of the Revised Code to allow a concealed handgun licensee to carry a deadly weapon or dangerous ordnance in a building or structure that is not a courthouse but in which a courtroom is located if court is not in session.

H. B. No. 273 - Representative Mathews. Cosponsor: Representative Seitz.

To amend sections 4109.08, 4111.09, 4112.07, 4115.07, 4123.54, 4123.83, and 4167.11 of the Revised Code to allow employers to post certain labor law

notices on the internet.

H. B. No. 274 - Representatives Mathews, Dell'Aquila. Cosponsors: Representatives Humphrey, McNally, Johnson, Miller, K., Richardson, Klopfenstein, Liston, Creech, Troy, Jarrells, Upchurch, Galonski, Grim, Brown, Thomas, C., Miller, A., Miranda, Somani, Weinstein, Miller, J., Baker, Brennan, Peterson, Williams, King, Carruthers, Demetriou.

To amend sections 323.152, 323.153, 4503.065, and 4503.066 of the Revised Code to authorize an enhanced property tax homestead exemption for certain long-term homeowners.

H. B. No. 275 - Representatives Young, T., Plummer.

To amend sections 4715.302, 4723.481, 4723.487, 4729.83, 4730.42, 4730.53, 4731.052, 4731.054, and 4731.055 and to enact sections 3719.065, 3719.081, and 3796.022 of the Revised Code to revise the law governing the review of patient information in the Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System, to establish requirements on the prescribing and dispensing of opioid analgesics, to establish the Medical Marijuana Control Program Fund and provide for a cash transfer, and to amend the version of section 4723.481 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect on September 30, 2024, to continue the changes to that section on and after that date.

H. B. No. 276 - Representatives Miller, M., Ray.

To repeal section 5501.60 of the Revised Code to remove the requirement that the Department of Transportation construct certain interstate interchanges.

H. B. No. 277 - Representatives Ray, Brent.

Cosponsors: Representatives Grim, Hoops, Carruthers, Baker.

To amend sections 5726.98, 5747.98, and 5751.98 and to enact sections 5726.61, 5747.86, and 5751.56 of the Revised Code to authorize a tax credit for landlords with policies that allow companion animals in rental dwellings.
