INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

The following bills were introduced:

H. B. No. 611 - Representative Ghanbari.

To enact section 5534.131 of the Revised Code to designate a portion of State Route 199 in Wood County as the "U.S. Army Private First Class Jerry Bockbrader Memorial Highway."

H. B. No. 612 - Representative Forhan.

To enact sections 124.77 and 3304.25 of the Revised Code to require state officers and employees to complete annual training on engaging with individuals who are neurodivergent.

To enact section 101.291 of the Revised Code to require the House of Representatives to contract with an independent third party to biannually conduct an audit of the House of Representatives' human resources practices.

H. B. No. 614 - Representative Forhan.

To require the Capitol Square Review and Advisory Board to examine the Statehouse in Columbus to identify symbols that resemble the swastika, to proceed with renovations necessary to remove the identified symbols, and to name this act the Statehouse Nazi Symbol Removal Act.
