In line 242, after "that" insert "same"; after "is" insert "also"; delete "dual"; after "citizen" insert "or national"

In line 243, delete "another country" and insert "one or more other countries, other than the United States,"; delete "is" and insert "are"; delete "adversary" and insert "adversaries"

After line 304, insert:

"(4) Protected property directly or indirectly acquired by an individual who is a United States citizen or national, unless that individual is purchasing or otherwise acquiring the property as an agent, fiduciary, or trustee of a person described in divisions (B)(1) to (5) of this section."
