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A BILL

To enact section 4113.14 of the Revised Code to 1  
enact the Pay Stub Protection Act requiring 2  
employers to provide earnings and deductions 3  
statements to each of the employer's employees. 4

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4113.14 of the Revised Code be 5  
enacted to read as follows: 6

Sec. 4113.14. (A) As used in this section: 7

(1) "Employee" and "employer" have the same meanings as in 8  
section 4113.51 of the Revised Code. 9

(2) "Workweek" means a fixed, regularly recurring period 10  
of one hundred sixty-eight hours that an employer expressly 11  
adopts for purposes of complying with section 7 of the "Fair 12  
Labor Standards Act of 1938," 29 U.S.C. 207. 13

(B) Every employer shall provide each of the employer's 14

employees with a written or electronic statement or access to a 15  
statement of the employee's earnings and deductions for each pay 16  
period on the employer's regular paydays. An employer shall 17  
include all of the following information in the statement: 18

(1) The employee's name; 19

(2) The employee's address; 20

(3) The employer's name; 21

(4) The total gross wages earned by the employee during 22  
the pay period; 23

(5) The total net wages paid to the employee for the pay 24  
period; 25

(6) A listing of the amount and purpose of each addition 26  
to or deduction from the wages paid to the employee during the 27  
pay period; 28

(7) The date the employee was paid and the pay period 29  
covered by that payment; 30

(8) For an employee who is paid on an hourly basis, all of 31  
the following information: 32

(a) The total number of hours the employee worked in that 33  
pay period; 34

(b) The hourly wage rate at which the employee was paid; 35

(c) The employee's hours worked in excess of forty hours 36  
in one workweek. 37

(C) An employee who does not receive a statement as 38  
required by division (B) of this section shall make a written 39  
request to the employee's employer to receive the statement. The 40  
employer shall provide the employee with the statement not later 41

than ten days after receiving the request. If the employee does 42  
not receive the requested statement within the ten-day period, 43  
the employee may submit a report of the violation to the 44  
director of commerce. If, on receipt of a report, the director 45  
determines that there are reasonable grounds to believe that a 46  
violation exists, the director shall issue a written notice to 47  
the employee's employer. On receipt of a notice, the employer 48  
shall immediately post the notice, or a copy of the notice, in a 49  
conspicuous place on the employer's premises. The employer shall 50  
keep the notice posted for ten days. 51

**Section 2.** This act shall be known as the Pay Stub 52  
Protection Act. 53
