# A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	5
4503.766 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	7
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	8
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	9
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	10
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	13

quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of20the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or21other abortion-related activities.22

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 35 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 36 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 37 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 38 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 39 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 40 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 41 directly to their clients. 42

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 43 receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 44 national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 45 it receives under this section to assist those who have 46 pancreatic cancer and their families. 47

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 49 Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 50 contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 51 support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 52

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar57receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to58special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions59for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar61receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the62children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the63contributions for its research and other programs.64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar65receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to66the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to67raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic68pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.69

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 70 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 71 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 72 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 73 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 74

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar75receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the76future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the77

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contributions into its general account to be used for78educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of79America foundation.80

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 81 receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 82 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 83 extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 84 the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 85

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 86 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 87 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 88 scholarships and other educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those contributions for scholarships for students who are members of that organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar95receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to96Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for97scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or98events the organization holds or sponsors in this state.99

The registrar shall pay the contributions received100pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio101aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to102facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational103programming.104

The registrar shall pay the contributions received105pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the106

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organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 107 organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 108 need. 109

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 110 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 111 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 112 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 113

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 114 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 115 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 116 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 117 section. A university or college that receives contributions 118 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 119 scholarship fund. 120

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 121 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 122 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 123 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 124 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 125 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 126 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 127 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 128 funds as provided in this section. 129

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 130 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 131 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 132 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 133 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 134 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 135 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 136

with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 137 funds as provided in this section. 138

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 139 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 140 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 141 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 142 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 143 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 144 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 145 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 146 funds as provided in this section. 147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 148 receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 149 Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 150 contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152 receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code 153 equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of 154 Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen 155 advocates for addiction recovery). 156

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar157receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the158Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying159for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio160cyclists of all ages.161

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 162 receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 163 "friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 164 incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 165

of this state, to assist that organization in paying the166expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable,167educational, and cultural events at the monument.168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar169receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the170fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for171the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the172lighthouses of fairport harbor.173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar174receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the175Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the176contributions only to promote and support the football team of177Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 180 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 181 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 182 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 183 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 184 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 185 sponsors within this state. 186

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 187 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 188 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 189 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 190 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 191 activities. 192

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 193 receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 194

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Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives195under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing196its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services197to children, young adults, and families in this state.198

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 199 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 200 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 201 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 202 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 203 204 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 205 research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 206 the improvement of patient outcomes. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 208 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 209 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 210 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 211 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 212 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 213 personnel, veterans, and their families. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar215receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the216Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for217the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house.218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 220 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 221 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 222 further the nonprofit's mission. 223

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 224 receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 225 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 226 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 227 families. 228

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 242 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 243 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 244 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 245 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 246 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 247 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 248 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 249 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 250 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 251 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 2.52

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 253

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receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 254 rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 255

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 256 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 257 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 258 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 259 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 260 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 261 262 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 263 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 264 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 265 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 266 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 267 under this section. 268

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar274receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the275western reserve historical society, which shall use the276contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.277

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar278receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the279Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple280negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the281contributions for charitable and educational purposes.282

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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 283 receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 284 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 285 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 286 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 287 the person who paid the contribution resides. 288

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 289 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 290 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 291 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 292 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 293 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 294 entertainment, business, and residential living. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 297 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 298 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 299 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 300 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 301 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 302 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 303 managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 304 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 305 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 306 such payments are to be made. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308 receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 309 Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 310 expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 311 river watershed. 312

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 313 receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 314 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 315 nature preserve. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar321receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the322Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the323contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.324

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar325receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the326girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the327contributions to support the activities of the organization.328

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar329receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the330Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use331the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and332rehabilitation, and educational programs.333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 335 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 336 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 337 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 338 local beekeeping programs. 339

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar340receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the341

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national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the342contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace343legends to inspire future leaders.344

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 345 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 346 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 347 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 348 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 349 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 350 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar352receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the353national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use354the contributions for educational purposes.355

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 360 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 361 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 362 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 363 center. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar365receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the366American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the367contributions to support the activities of the organization.368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar369receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the370

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Ohio oil and gas energy education foundation to fund371scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and372natural gas industry.373

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 374 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 375 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 376 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 377 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 378 commission and that is participating in the license plate 379 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 380 of the county of residence of an applicant. 381

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each382contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of383the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates384that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is385participating in the license plate program pursuant to division386(G) of that section.387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 389 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 390 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 391 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 392 Ohio and for educational programs. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 395 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 396 supporting cancer research. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar398receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the399

Stan Hywet hall and gardens.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 401 receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 402 403 Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad.

404 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 405 Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 406 contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 407 408 pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409 receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 410 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 411 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 412 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 413

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 414 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 415 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 416 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 417 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 418 419 scouts.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 420 receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 421 Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 422 shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 423 throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 424

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 425 receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 426 charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 427 which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 428

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar429receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the430Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,431which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 434 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 435 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 436 charitable purposes. 437

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar438receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the439Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose.440

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 441 receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 442 Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 443 of Dayton. 444

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar445receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the446fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall447deposit the fees into its general account to be used for448purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 451 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 452 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 453 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 454 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 455 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 456

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 457

pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio458concerns of police survivors, which shall use those459contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate460to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed461in the line of duty.462

The registrar shall pay the contributions received463pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater464Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those465contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in466the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.467

The registrar shall pay the contributions received468pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio469association of chiefs of police.470

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 471 receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 472 Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 473 cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 474 memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 475 families. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar477receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the478fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall479use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.480

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 481 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 482 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 483 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 484 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 485 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 486

administering a program to secure the proper representation in487the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent488children, and for the training and supervision of persons489participating in that program.490

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar495receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the496Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,497which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and498advocacy purposes throughout the state.499

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 500 receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 501 ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 502 split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 503 association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 504 agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 505 be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 506 advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 507 lives to the fullest. 508

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar509receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to510Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the511contributions into its general account to be used for purposes512of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.513

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar514receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the515

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Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 516 commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 517 Cleveland, Ohio. 518

The school shall use fifty per cent of the1146contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its1147students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit1148arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of1149

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the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1151receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1152Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1153corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1154contributions for any political purpose.1155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1156receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1157Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1158Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1159any political purpose.1160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1161receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1162Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1163high school shall not use the contributions for any political1164purpose.1165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1166receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to1167Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use1168contributions to fund college and career technical training1169scholarships for students.1170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1171receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1172friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1173to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1174emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1176receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1177Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1178

activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1179 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1180

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1181 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1182 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1183 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1184 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1185 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1186 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1187 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1188

Sec. 4503.766. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1189 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1190 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1191 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1192 and issuance of "Ohio Society Daughters of the American 1193 Revolution" license plates. The application may be combined with 1194 a request for a special reserved license plate under section 1195 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the 1196 completed application and compliance by the applicant with 1197 divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue 1198 to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set 1199 of "Ohio Society Daughters of the American Revolution" license 1200 plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone 1201 when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1202
