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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.4912 of the Revised Code to create the 2  
"Continue Your Story" specialty license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.4912 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4912 of the Revised Code to 23  
the Ben Morrison memorial fund, which shall use the 24  
contributions for scholarships and other programs that support 25  
mental health. 26

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 27  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 28  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 29  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 30  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 31  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 32  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 33  
other money in that fund. 34

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 35  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 36  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 37  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 38

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 39  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 40  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 41  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 42  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 43  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 44  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 45  
directly to their clients. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 48

national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 49  
it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with 50  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 53  
Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 54  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 55  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 56

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 57  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 58  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 59  
its research and other programs. 60

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 61  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 62  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 63  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 64

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 65  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 66  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 67  
contributions for its research and other programs. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 70  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 71  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 72  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 75  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 76  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 77

research for the cure of childhood cancers. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81  
contributions into its general account to be used for 82  
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83  
America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 86  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 87  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 88  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 91  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 92  
scholarships and other educational activities. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97  
that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 99  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 100  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 101  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 102  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 105  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 106

facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 107  
programming. 108

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 109  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 110  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 111  
organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 112  
need. 113

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 114  
receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 115  
kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 116  
Ohio chapters of a kid again. 117

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 118  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 119  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 120  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 121  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 122  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 123  
scholarship fund. 124

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 125  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 126  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 127  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 128  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 129  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 130  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 131  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 132  
funds as provided in this section. 133

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 134  
receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 135

Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 136  
of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 137  
attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 138  
funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 139  
program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 140  
with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 141  
funds as provided in this section. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143  
receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 144  
university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 145  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 146  
the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 147  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 148  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 149  
university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 150  
funds as provided in this section. 151

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 152  
receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the 153  
Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the 154  
contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign. 155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 157  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 158  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 159  
cyclists of all ages. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 161  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 162  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 163  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 164  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 165

expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 166  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 168  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 169  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 170  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 171  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 174  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 175  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 176  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 179  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 180  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 181  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 182  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 183  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 184  
sponsors within this state. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 187  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 188  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 189  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 190  
activities. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 192  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 193  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 194

under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 195  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 196  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 199  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 200  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 201  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 202  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 203  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 204  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 205  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 208  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 209  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 210  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 211  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 212  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 215  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 216  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 217  
families. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 220  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 221  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 222  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 223  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 224



of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 225  
destination. 226

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 227  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 228  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 229  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 230  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 231

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 232  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 233  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 234  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 235  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 236  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 237  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 238  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 239  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 240  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 241  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 242

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 243  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 244  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 245

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 246  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 247  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 248  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 249  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 250  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 251  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 252  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 253  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 254

for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 255  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 256  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 257  
under this section. 258

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 259  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 260  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 261  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 262  
programs. 263

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 264  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 265  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 266  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 267

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 268  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 269  
Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 270  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 271  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 272

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 273  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 274  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 275  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 276  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 277  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 278

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 279  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 280  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 281  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 282  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 283

distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 284  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 285  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 286  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 287  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 288  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 289  
such payments are to be made. 290

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 291  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 292  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 293  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 294  
river watershed. 295

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 296  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 297  
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 298  
nature preserve. 299

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 300  
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 301  
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 302  
the money in support of the park. 303

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 304  
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 305  
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 306  
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 307

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 308  
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 309  
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 310  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 311

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 312

receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 313  
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 314  
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 315  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 316  
local beekeeping programs. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 319  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 320  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 321  
legends to inspire future leaders. 322

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 323  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 324  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 325  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 326  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 327  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 328  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 331  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 332  
the contributions for educational purposes. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 335  
Ohio sons of the American legion, which shall use the 336  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 337

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 338  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 339  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 340  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 341

professional sports team located in the county of that sports 342  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 343  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 344  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 345

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 346  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 347  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 348  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 349  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 350  
(G) of that section. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 353  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 354  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 355  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 356  
Ohio and for educational programs. 357

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 358  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 359  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 360  
supporting cancer research. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 363  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 366  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 367

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 368  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 369  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 370

contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 371  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 372

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 373  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 374  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 375  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 376  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 377

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 378  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 379  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 380  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 381  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 382  
scouts. 383

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 384  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 385  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 386  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 387  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 388

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 389  
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 390  
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 391  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 392

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 393  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 394  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 395  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 396

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 397  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 398  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 399

of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 400  
charitable purposes. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402  
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 403  
Ohio chapter of the loyal order of the moose. 404

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 405  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 406  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 407  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 408  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 411  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 412  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 413  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 414  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 415  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 416

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 417  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 418  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 419  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 420  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 421  
in the line of duty. 422

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 423  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 424  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 425  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 426  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 428

pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 429  
association of chiefs of police. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 431  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 432  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 433  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 434  
families. 435

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 436  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 437  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 438  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 439

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 440  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 441  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 442  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 443  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 444  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 445  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 446  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 447  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 448  
participating in that program. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 451  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 452  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 455  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 456  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 457



advocacy purposes throughout the state. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 459  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 460  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 461  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 462  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 463  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 464  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 465  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 466  
lives to the fullest. 467

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 468  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 469  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 470  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 471  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 472

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 473  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 474  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 475  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 476  
Cleveland, Ohio. 477

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 478  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 479  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 480  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 481  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 482  
geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 483  
resides. 484

abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1004  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1005  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1006  
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1007  
discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1008  
charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1009  
services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1010  
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1011  
subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school 1012  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any other 1013  
purpose. 1014

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1015  
receives pursuant to section 4503.954 of the Revised Code to 1016  
University school located in the suburban area near the 1017  
municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty 1018  
per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition 1019  
assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining 1020  
fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 1021  
services to the school's students that assist in developing or 1022  
maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 1023  
The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 1024  
instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 1025  
training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1026  
bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1027  
human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1028  
school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1029  
receive training in providing those services. The school 1030  
principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1031

school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 1032  
that the school hires to provide those services. The school 1033  
shall ensure that any such charitable organization is exempt 1034  
from federal income taxation under subsection 501(c)(3) of the 1035  
Internal Revenue Code. The school shall not use the 1036  
contributions it receives for any other purpose. 1037

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1038  
receives pursuant to section 4503.955 of the Revised Code to 1039  
Saint Albert the Great school located in North Royalton. The 1040  
school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1041  
to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1042  
use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1043  
in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1044  
developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1045  
the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1046  
counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1047  
sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1048  
students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1049  
suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1050  
providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1051  
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1052

receives pursuant to section 4503.957 of the Revised Code to 1067  
John F. Kennedy Catholic school located in Warren. The school 1068  
shall not use the contributions it receives for any political 1069  
purpose. 1070

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1071  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1072  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1073  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1074  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1075  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1076  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1077  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1078

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1079  
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1080  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1081  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1082  
contributions for any political purpose. 1083

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1084  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1085  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1086  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1087  
any political purpose. 1088

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1089  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1090  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1091

high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1092  
purpose. 1093

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1094  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1095  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1096  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1097  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1098

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1099  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1100  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1101  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1102  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1103

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1104  
contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1105  
the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1106  
distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1107  
section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1108  
calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1109  
entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1110  
received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1111

**Sec. 4503.4912.** (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1112  
car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1113  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1114  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1115  
and issuance of "Continue Your Story" license plates. The 1116  
application may be combined with a request for a special 1117  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1118  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1119  
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1120  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1121

appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Continue Your Story" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1122  
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In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "Continue Your Story" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by representatives of the Ben Morrison memorial fund and approved by the registrar. "Continue Your Story" license plates shall display county identification stickers that identify the county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1126  
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(B) "Continue Your Story" license plates and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor vehicles. 1134  
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(C) (1) For each application for registration and registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of ten dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1146  
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(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1152  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1153  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1154  
of "Continue Your Story" license plates, into the state treasury 1155  
to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund 1156  
created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1157
