# A BILL

To establish a pilot program for remote treatment	1
of opioid use disorder and to make an	2
appropriation.	3

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. (A) As used in this section, "opioid treatment 4 program" has the same meaning as in section 5119.01 of the 5 Revised Code. 6 (B) Not later than sixty days after the effective date of 7 this section, the Department of Mental Health and Addiction 8 Services shall establish a pilot program to provide grant 9 funding for the provision of remote methadone treatment, through 10 opioid treatment programs licensed under section 5119.37 of the 11 Revised Code, to individuals with opioid use disorder. The pilot 12 program shall operate during fiscal year 2024 and fiscal year 13 2025. The Department shall ensure that the pilot program and 14 participating opioid treatment programs are in compliance with 15 all federal and state laws, regulations, and rules concerning 16 take-home methadone dosing. 17

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(C) Any opioid treatment program licensed under section 18 5119.37 of the Revised Code may apply to the Department for 19 consideration to participate in the pilot program, and the 20 Department shall provide notice to all licensed opioid treatment 21 programs of the opportunity to apply. From the applicants, the 22 Department shall select up to ten opioid treatment programs to 23 participate in the pilot program, and those that are selected 24 shall receive grant funding through the pilot program. The 2.5 Department shall use its best efforts to ensure that selected 26 opioid treatment programs represent varied geographic areas 27 across this state. 28 (D) Each opioid treatment program that is selected to 29 participate in the pilot program shall procure a remote 30 methadone treatment vendor. The Department shall create a list 31 of possible vendors that use or offer all of the following 32 accessibility and security requirements: 33 (1) Browser-based applications and non-local stream 34 recording; 35 (2) Asynchronous audio-visual dosing sessions; 36 (3) Patient-clinician communication and at least monthly 37 patient check-ins; 38 (4) Combined physical and digital bottle-tamper awareness; 39 (5) Unique dose identifiers; 40 (6) Data aggregation capabilities and performance of 41 monthly documentation; 42 (7) Equity-focused design and inclusive implementation 43 protocols, including by minimizing patient literacy barriers; 44 (8) High-tier security measures that are compliant with 45

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the "Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996," 42 U.S.C. 1320d et seq., and the regulations adopted thereunder;

(9) Customer support.

(E) Opioid treatment programs that are selected to
participate in the pilot program shall provide, and the
Department shall collect from those participants, data on
patient outcomes, including information regarding time in
treatment, patient retention, and realized reductions in
medication transportation costs as compared to in-person dosing.

Not later than six months after the conclusion of the56pilot program, the Department shall complete a report on the57information collected and findings from the pilot program. On58completion, the Department shall submit the report to the59Governor and to the General Assembly. The Department shall60submit the report to the General Assembly in accordance with61section 101.68 of the Revised Code.62

Section 2. All items in this act are hereby appropriated63as designated out of any moneys in the state treasury to the64credit of the designated fund. For all operating appropriations65made in this act, those in the first column are for fiscal year662024 and those in the second column are for fiscal year 2025.67The operating appropriations made in this act are in addition to68any other operating appropriations made for these fiscal years.69
