To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section	1
4503.965 of the Revised Code to create the	2
"Norton Music Boosters" license plate.	3

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and section	4
4503.965 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	6
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	7
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid	8
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of	9
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced	10
in division (B) of this section.	11
(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the	12
registrar collects in the fund as follows:	13
The registrar shall pay the contributions received	14
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast	15
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for	16
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast	17
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to	18
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of	19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20 other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34 receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35 national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36 amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37 chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38 chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39 assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40 directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar42receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the43national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money44it receives under this section to assist those who have45pancreatic cancer and their families.46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar47receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the48

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Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the49contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social50support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar52receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the53St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for54its research and other programs.55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58 for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar60receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the61children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the62contributions for its research and other programs.63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar64receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to65the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to66raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic67pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69 receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70 the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71 children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72 research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74 receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75 future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76 contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university

extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay

the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85 pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86 cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87 scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89 pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90 organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91 contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92 that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94 receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95 Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96 scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97 events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received99pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio100aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to101facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational102programming.103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received104pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the105organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that106

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organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in 107 need.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 109 receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a 110 kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the 111 Ohio chapters of a kid again. 112

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 113 receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 114 university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 115 collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 116 section. A university or college that receives contributions 117 from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 118 scholarship fund. 119

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 120 receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 121 university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 122 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 123 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 124 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 125 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 126 university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 127 funds as provided in this section. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129 receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to 130 Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes 131 of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who 132 attend the university. The university shall not use any of the 133 funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship 134 program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements 135 with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such 136

funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138 receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the 139 university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of 140 awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 141 the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 142 receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 143 The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 144 university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such 145 146 funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar147receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the148Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the149contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery).

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 156 receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 157 Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 158 for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 159 cyclists of all ages. 160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar161receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the162"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial,163incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws164of this state, to assist that organization in paying the165

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expenses it i	ncurs in sponsorin	g or holding	g charitable, 16	6

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar168receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the169fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for170the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the171lighthouses of fairport harbor.172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar173receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the174Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the175contributions only to promote and support the football team of176Washington high school of the Massillon city school district.177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178 receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 179 United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 180 distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 181 States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 182 district shall use the money it receives under this section to 183 pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 184 sponsors within this state. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186 receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 187 Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 188 international, which shall use the money it receives under this 189 section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 190 activities. 191

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar192receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the193Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives194

under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 195
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 196
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 197

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 198 receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 199 Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 200 receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 201 to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 202 to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 203 204 their education, and to support persons conducting nursing research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 205 the improvement of patient outcomes. 206

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 207 receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 208 thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 209 organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 210 organization in paying for the charitable activities and 211 programs it sponsors in support of United States military 212 personnel, veterans, and their families. 213

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 214 receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 215 Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 216 the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 217

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 218 receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the 219 nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry 220 health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to 221 further the nonprofit's mission. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 224 disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 225 programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 226 families. 227

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 241 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 242 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 243 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 244 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 245 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 246 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 247 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 248 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 249 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 250 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 251

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar252receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the253

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rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 255 receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 256 Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 257 corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 258 the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 259 members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 260 charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 261 provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 262 Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 263 for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 264 promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 265 incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 266 under this section. 2.67

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar273receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the274western reserve historical society, which shall use the275contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar277receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the278Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple279negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the280contributions for charitable and educational purposes.281

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 282

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receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 283 central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 284 which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 285 Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 286 the person who paid the contribution resides. 287

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 288 receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to 289 playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use 290 the contributions to further its mission of presenting and 291 producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing 292 arts education, and creating a superior destination for 293 entertainment, business, and residential living. 294

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 295 receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 296 state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 297 deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 298 establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 299 distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 300 ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 301 302 for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 303 Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 304 registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 305 such payments are to be made. 306

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

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receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 313 Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 314 nature preserve. 315

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 316 receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 317 conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 318 the money in support of the park. 319

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar320receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the321Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the322contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar324receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the325girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the326contributions to support the activities of the organization.327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328 receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 329 Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 330 the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 331 rehabilitation, and educational programs. 332

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 333 receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 334 Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 335 contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 336 information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 337 local beekeeping programs. 338

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar339receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the340national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the341

legends to inspire future leaders. 343 The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 344 receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 345 keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 346 contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 347 to take greater responsibility for improving the local 348 environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 349 greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 350

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 351 receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 352 national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 353 the contributions for educational purposes. 354

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 355 receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 356 Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 357 contributions to support the activities of the organization. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359 receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 360 progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 361 shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 362 center. 363

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar368receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the369Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students370

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pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 372 pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 373 contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 374 applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 375 professional sports team located in the county of that sports 376 commission and that is participating in the license plate 377 program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 378 of the county of residence of an applicant. 379

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each380contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of381the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates382that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is383participating in the license plate program pursuant to division384(G) of that section.385

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 386 receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 387 pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 388 which shall use the contributions for the protection and 389 preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 390 Ohio and for educational programs. 391

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 392 receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 393 pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 394 supporting cancer research. 395

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar396receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the397Stan Hywet hall and gardens.398

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 399

receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 400 Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar402receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the403Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the404contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville405pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event.406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar407receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the408Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council409shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner410throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412 receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 413 girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 414 heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 415 manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 416 scouts. 417

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar418receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the419Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council420shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner421throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts.422

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar423receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the424charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m.,425which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.426

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar427receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the428

Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio,429which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 431 receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 432 Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 433 of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 434 charitable purposes. 435

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar436receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the437Ohio state moose association.438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation of Dayton.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 448 receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 449 fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 450 deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 451 used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 452 enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 453 methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 454

The registrar shall pay the contributions received455pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio456concerns of police survivors, which shall use those457

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contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate458to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed459in the line of duty.460

The registrar shall pay the contributions received461pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater462Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those463contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in464the line of duty and support its charitable purposes.465

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio association of chiefs of police.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479 receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 480 organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 481 association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 482 Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 483 shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 484 administering a program to secure the proper representation in 485 the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 486

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children, and for the training and supervision of persons 487 participating in that program. 488

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar489receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the490Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the491contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.492

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar493receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the494Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention,495which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and496advocacy purposes throughout the state.497

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the fullest.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar507receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to508Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the509contributions into its general account to be used for purposes510of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated.511

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar512receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the513Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to514commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in515

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Cleveland, Ohio.

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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 517 receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 518 central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 519 foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 520 chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 521 geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 522 resides. 523

The 1060 school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the 1061 expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's 1062 students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and 1063 emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may 1064 include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving 1065 techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and 1066 education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug 1067 abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1068 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1069 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1070 services. The school principal or, in the school principal's 1071 discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any 1072 charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those 1073 services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable 1074 organization is exempt from federal income taxation under 1075

subsection 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The school1076shall not use the contributions it receives for any other1077purpose.1078

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1079 receives pursuant to section 4503.954 of the Revised Code to 1080 University school located in the suburban area near the 1081 municipal corporation of Cleveland. The school shall use fifty 1082 per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition 1083 assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining 1084 fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing 1085 services to the school's students that assist in developing or 1086 maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. 1087

The services provided may include bereavement counseling, 1088 instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity 1089 training, and the counseling and education of students regarding 1090 bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and 1091 human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the 1092 school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to 1093 receive training in providing those services. The school 1094 principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate 1095 school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations 1096 that the school hires to provide those services. The 1104 school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives 1105 to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall 1106 use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs 1107 in providing services to the school's students that assist in 1108 developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of 1109 the students. The services provided may include bereavement 1110 counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, 1111 sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of 1112 students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, 1113 suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of 1114 providing such services, the school may pay for members of the 1115 faculty of the school to receive training in providing those 1116 services. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1135 receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1136 Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1137 Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1138 contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1139 students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1140 arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1141 the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1143receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to1144Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal1145corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the1146contributions for any political purpose.1147

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1148receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to1149Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of1150Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for1151any political purpose.1152

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1153receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to1154Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The1155high school shall not use the contributions for any political1156purpose.1157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1158receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to1159Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use1160contributions to fund college and career technical training1161scholarships for students.1162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1163receives pursuant to section 4503.965 of the Revised Code to the1164Norton music boosters association. The association shall use the1165contributions to provide financial assistance to the Norton high1166school music boosters for equipment, travel, and programming1167expenses.1168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1169receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the1170friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money1171to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free1172emergency medical first response throughout Israel.1173

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar1174receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the1175Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and1176

activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1177 city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1178

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate 1179 contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than 1180 the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall 1181 distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this 1182 section the investment income the fund earned the previous 1183 calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an 1184 entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity 1185 received from the fund during the previous calendar year. 1186

Sec. 4503.965. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1187 car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1188 vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1189 may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1190 and issuance of "Norton Music Boosters" license plates.
