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**A BILL**

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact section 1  
4503.512 of the Revised Code to create the "Iota 2  
Phi Theta" license plate. 3

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

**Section 1.** That section 4501.21 be amended and section 4  
4503.512 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 5

**Sec. 4501.21.** (A) There is hereby created in the state 6  
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 7  
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 8  
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 9  
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 10  
in division (B) of this section. 11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 12  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 13

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 14  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 15  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 16  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 17  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 18  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 19

the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 20  
other abortion-related activities. 21

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 22  
receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the 23  
organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall 24  
deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that 25  
organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend 26  
the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same 27  
manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends 28  
other money in that fund. 29

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 30  
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism 31  
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs 32  
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state. 33

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 34  
receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the 35  
national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal 36  
amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley 37  
chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These 38  
chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to 39  
assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services 40  
directly to their clients. 41

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 42  
receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the 43  
national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money 44  
it receives under this section to assist those who have 45  
pancreatic cancer and their families. 46

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 47  
receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the 48

Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the 49  
contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social 50  
support services for adults who have sickle cell disease. 51

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 52  
receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the 53  
St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for 54  
its research and other programs. 55

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 56  
receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 57  
special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 58  
for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities. 59

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 60  
receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the 61  
children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the 62  
contributions for its research and other programs. 63

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 64  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to 65  
the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to 66  
raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic 67  
pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer. 68

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 69  
receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to 70  
the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 71  
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 72  
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 73

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 74  
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 75  
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 76  
contributions into its general account to be used for 77

educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 78  
America foundation. 79

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 80  
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 81  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 82  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 83  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 85  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 86  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 87  
scholarships and other educational activities. 88

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 89  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 90  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 91  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 92  
that organization. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 94  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 95  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 96  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 97  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 99  
pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 100  
aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to 101  
facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational 102  
programming. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104  
pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the 105  
organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that 106

organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in need. 107  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again. 109  
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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund. 113  
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The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.512 of the Revised Code to the Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter in Ohio. The Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter shall use the contributions for the development and perpetuation of scholarship, leadership, citizenship, fidelity, and brotherhood among men and youth in this state. 120  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section. 128  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery).

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying

for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 167  
cyclists of all ages. 168

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 169  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 170  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial,  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 171  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 172  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 173  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 174  
175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 176  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 177  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 178  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 179  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 180

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 181  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 182  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 183  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 184  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 185

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 186  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 187  
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 188  
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 189  
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 190  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 191  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 192  
sponsors within this state. 193

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 194  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 195

Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 196  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 197  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 198  
activities. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 200  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 201  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 202  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 203  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 204  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 205

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 206  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 207  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 208  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 209  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 210  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 211  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 212  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 213  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 214

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 215  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 216  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 217  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 218  
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 219  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 220  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 221

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 222  
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 223  
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 224  
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 225



The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to further the nonprofit's mission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and

cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 256  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 257  
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 258  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 261  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 262

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 263  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 264  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 265  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 266  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 267  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 268  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 269  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 270  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 271  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 272  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 273  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 274  
under this section. 275

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 276  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 277  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 278  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 279  
programs. 280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 281  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 282  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 283  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 284

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which such payments are to be made.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning river watershed.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and rehabilitation, and educational programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those

contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 344  
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 345  
local beekeeping programs. 346

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 347  
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 348  
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 349  
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 350  
legends to inspire future leaders. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352  
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 353  
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 354  
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 355  
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 356  
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 357  
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 358

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 359  
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 360  
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 361  
the contributions for educational purposes. 362

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 363  
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 364  
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 365  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 366

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 367  
receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the 368  
progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which 369  
shall use the contributions to support the activities of the 370  
center. 371

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 372

receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the 373  
American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the 374  
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 375

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 376  
receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the 377  
Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students 378  
pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry. 379

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created 380  
pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each 381  
contribution the registrar receives under that section that an 382  
applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a 383  
professional sports team located in the county of that sports 384  
commission and that is participating in the license plate 385  
program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 386  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 387

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 388  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 389  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 390  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 391  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 392  
(G) of that section. 393

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 394  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 395  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 396  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 397  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 398  
Ohio and for educational programs. 399

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 400  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 401

pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 402  
supporting cancer research. 403

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 404  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 405  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 406

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 407  
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 408  
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 409

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 410  
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 411  
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 412  
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 413  
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 414

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 415  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 416  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 417  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 418  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 419

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 420  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 421  
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 422  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 423  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 424  
scouts. 425

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 426  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 427  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 428  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 429  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 430

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for charitable purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state moose association.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation of Dayton.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the fees into its general account to be used for purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be



used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 460  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 461  
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 462

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 463  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 464  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 465  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 466  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 467  
in the line of duty. 468

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 469  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 470  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 471  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 472  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 473

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 474  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 475  
association of chiefs of police. 476

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 477  
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 478  
Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 479  
cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 480  
memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 481  
families. 482

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 483  
receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the 484  
fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall 485  
use the contributions to further the mission of the commission. 486

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 487  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 488

organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 489  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 490  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 491  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 492  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 493  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 494  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 495  
participating in that program. 496

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 497  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 498  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 499  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 500

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 501  
receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the 502  
Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, 503  
which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and 504  
advocacy purposes throughout the state. 505

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 506  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 507  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 508  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 509  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 510

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The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.942 of the Revised Code to zero, the end of prostate cancer, incorporated, a nonprofit organization, which shall use those contributions to raise awareness of prostate cancer, to support research to end prostate cancer, and to support prostate cancer patients and their families. 1024  
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The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.944 of the Revised Code to the eastern European congress of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.945 of the Revised Code to the Summit metro parks foundation, which shall use the money in support of the Summit county metro parks.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.951 of the Revised Code to the Cincinnati city school district.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.952 of the Revised Code to Hawken school located in northeast Ohio. The school shall use fifty per cent of the contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its students. The school shall use the remaining fifty per cent to pay the expenses it incurs in providing services to the school's students that assist in developing or maintaining the mental and emotional well-being of the students. The services provided may include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving techniques, sensitivity training, and the counseling and education of students regarding bullying, dating violence, drug abuse, suicide prevention, and human trafficking. As a part of providing such services, the school may pay for members of the faculty of the school to receive training in providing those services. The school principal or, in the school principal's discretion, appropriate school counselors shall determine any charitable organizations that the school hires to provide those services. The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1143  
receives pursuant to section 4503.958 of the Revised Code to 1144  
Elder high school located in the municipal corporation of 1145  
Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1146  
contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1147  
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1148  
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1149  
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1150

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1151

receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1152  
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1153  
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1154  
contributions for any political purpose. 1155

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1156  
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1157  
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1158  
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1159  
any political purpose. 1160

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1161  
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1162  
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1163  
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1164  
purpose. 1165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1166  
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1167  
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1168  
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1169  
scholarships for students. 1170

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1171  
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1172  
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1173  
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1174  
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1175

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1176  
receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the 1177  
Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and 1178  
activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the 1179  
city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park." 1180



(C) All investment earnings of the license plate contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this section the investment income the fund earned the previous calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity received from the fund during the previous calendar year.

Sec. 4503.512. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Iota Phi Theta" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and the applicant's compliance with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Iota Phi Theta" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code.

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "Iota Phi Theta" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are selected by representatives of the Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Incorporated Delta Theta Omega chapter in Ohio and approved by the registrar. "Iota Phi Theta" license plates shall display county identification stickers that identify the county of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code.

(B) "Iota Phi Theta" license plates and a validation

sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon 1211  
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle 1212  
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as 1213  
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1214  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1215  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1216  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1217  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1218  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1219  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1220  
vehicles. 1221

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1222  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1223  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of fifteen 1224  
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the 1225  
state treasury to the credit of the license plate contribution 1226  
fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised Code. 1227

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1228  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1229  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1230  
of "Iota Phi Theta" license plates, into the state treasury to 1231  
the credit of the public safety - highway purposes fund created 1232  
in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1233
