A BILL

То	amend sections 955.20 and 955.221 of the Revised	1
	Code to require a county auditor to transfer	2
	certain funds from the county's dog and kennel	3
	fund to municipal corporations within the county	4
	that employ dog wardens.	5

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 955.20 and 955.221 of the Revised	6
Code be amended to read as follows:	7
Sec. 955.20. The registration fees provided for in	8
sections 955.01 to 955.14 of the Revised Code constitute a	9
special fund known as "the dog and kennel fund." The fees shall	10
be deposited by the county auditor in the county treasury daily	11
as collected. Money in the fund shall be used for the purpose of	12
defraying the cost of furnishing all blanks, records, tags,	13
nets, and other equipment, for the purpose of paying the	14
compensation of county dog wardens, deputies, poundkeepers, and	15
other employees necessary to carry out and enforce sections	16
955.01 to 955.261 of the Revised Code, and in accordance with	17
section 955.27 and division (B)(3)(b) of section 955.221 of the	18
Revised Code. The board of county commissioners, by resolution,	19

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shall appropriate sufficient funds out of the dog and kennel 20 fund, not more than fifteen per cent of which shall be expended 21 by the auditor for registration tags, blanks, records, and clerk 22 hire, for the purpose of defraying the necessary expenses of 23 registering, seizing, impounding, and destroying dogs in 2.4 accordance with sections 955.01 to 955.27 of the Revised Code, 2.5 and for the purpose of covering any additional expenses incurred 26 by the county auditor as authorized by division (E)(3) of 27 section 955.14 of the Revised Code. 28

If the funds so appropriated in any calendar year are found by the board to be insufficient to defray the necessary cost and expense of the county dog warden in enforcing sections 955.01 to 955.27 of the Revised Code, the board, by resolution so provided, may appropriate further funds for the use and purpose of the county dog warden in administering those sections.

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Sec. 955.221. (A) For the purposes of this section, 36 ordinances or resolutions to control dogs include, but are not 37 limited to, ordinances or resolutions concerned with the 38 ownership, keeping, or harboring of dogs, the restraint of dogs, 39 dogs as public nuisances, and dogs as a threat to public health, 40 safety, and welfare, except that such ordinances or resolutions 41 as permitted in division (B) of this section shall not prohibit 42 the use of any dog which is lawfully engaged in hunting or 43 training for the purpose of hunting while accompanied by a 44 licensed hunter. However, such dogs at all other times and in 45 all other respects shall be subject to the ordinance or 46 resolution permitted by this section, unless actually in the 47 field and engaged in hunting or in legitimate training for such 48 49 purpose.

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(B)(1) A board of county commissioners may adopt and	50	
enforce resolutions to control dogs within the unincorporated	51	
areas of the county that are not otherwise in conflict with any	52	
other provision of the Revised Code.	53	
(2) A board of township trustees may adopt and enforce	54	
resolutions to control dogs within the township that are not	55	
otherwise in conflict with any other provision of the Revised	56	
Code, if the township is located in a county where the board of	57	
county commissioners has not adopted resolutions to control dogs	58	
within the unincorporated areas of the county under this	59	
section. In the event that the board of county commissioners	60	
adopts resolutions to control dogs in the county after a board	61	
of township trustees has adopted resolutions to control dogs	62	
within the township, the resolutions adopted by the county board	63	
of commissioners prevail over the resolutions adopted by the	64	
board of township trustees.	65	
(3)(a) A municipal corporation may adopt and enforce	66	
ordinances to control dogs within the municipal corporation that		
are not otherwise in conflict with any other provision of the		
Revised Code.	69	
(b) If a municipal corporation employs one or more dog	70	
wardens, deputies, poundkeepers, or other employees to implement	71	
and enforce ordinances adopted under division (B)(3)(a) of this	72	
section, the applicable county auditor shall transfer to the	73	
municipal corporation all dog registration fees paid by	74	
residents of that municipal corporation. The county auditor	75	
shall make such payments from the applicable county's dog and	76	
kennel fund created under section 955.20 of the Revised Code.	77	
The municipal corporation shall use the funds so received to pay	78	
for the compensation of such dog wardens, deputies,	79	

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poundkeepers, and other employees necessary to carry out and	80	
enforce sections 955.01 to 955.261 of the Revised Code and	81	
similar municipal ordinances.	82	
(C) No person shall violate any resolution or ordinance	83	
adopted under this section.	84	
Section 2. That existing sections 955.20 and 955.221 of	85	
the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	86
