A BILL

To enact section 3345.462 of the Revised Code to	1
prohibit a state institution of higher education	2
from reducing institutional financial aid as a	3
result of private scholarship awards.	4

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3345.462 of the Revised Code be	5
enacted to read as follows:	6
Sec. 3345.462. (A) As used in this section:	7
(1) "Cost of attendance" means the average annual cost for	8
a student to attend the student's college or university,	9
including instructional fees, general fees, room and board,	10
books, supplies, and other expenses used to calculate financial	11
aid for an eligible student under Title IV of the "Higher	12
Education Act of 1965," 20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.	13
(2) "Institutional financial aid" means the sum of all	14
need-based and merit-based grants, scholarships, tuition	15
waivers, and all other forms of financial assistance a student	16
receives from the student's college or university, excluding	17
loans or work-study programs.	18

<u>(3) "Private scholarship" means a scholarship awarded by a</u>	19
business, private foundation, nonprofit organization, or service	20
group. "Private scholarship" does not include an award funded by	21
a private organization affiliated with a state institution of	22
higher education where the state institution provides assistance	23
in selecting an award recipient.	24
(4) "State institution of higher education" has the same	25
meaning as in section 3345.011 of the Revised Code.	26
(B) No state institution of higher education shall reduce	27
a student's institutional financial aid because the student	28
receives one or more private scholarships, except as provided	29
for in division (C) or (D) of this section.	30
(C) A state institution may reduce a student's	31
institutional financial aid if the student's total financial aid	32
from all sources, including private scholarships, exceeds the	33
student's cost of attendance. In that case, the state	34
institution may reduce the student's institutional financial aid	35
until the student's total financial aid no longer exceeds the	36
student's cost of attendance.	37
(D) A state institution may reduce a student's	38
institutional financial aid to comply with the individual or	39
team financial aid restrictions of an athletic association,	40
conference, or other group or organization with authority over	41
intercollegiate athletics, including the national collegiate	42
athletics association or its successor organization.	43
