## A RESOLUTION

| To urge the Congress of the United States to enact | 1 |

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

| WHEREAS, President Roosevelt signed the Servicemen's             | 6  |

| Readjustment Act (G.I. Bill) on June 22, 1944, establishing into | 7  |
| law sweeping benefits for veterans, including college tuition,   | 8  |
| low-cost home loans, and unemployment insurance; and             | 9  |
| WHEREAS, Racial disparities in the implementation of the         | 10 |
| G.I. Bill prevented Black veterans from securing the G.I. Bill's | 11 |
| benefits; and  | 12 |
| WHEREAS, Black veterans who qualified for benefits often         | 13 |
| could not find facilities that delivered on the G.I. Bill's      | 14 |
| promise; and   | 15 |
| WHEREAS, Although the G.I. Bill guaranteed low-interest          | 16 |
| mortgages and other loans, they were not administered by the     | 17 |
| Department of Veterans Affairs itself. Thus, the Department      | 18 |
| could cosign, but not actually guarantee the loans. This gave    | 19 |
| financial institutions free rein to refuse mortgages and loans   | 20 |

to Black veterans; and

WHEREAS, Redlining, a practice of marking maps by race to characterize the risks of lending money and providing insurance, made purchasing a home even more difficult for Black veterans; and

WHEREAS, On February 28, 2023, Massachusetts Congressman Seth Wilbur Moulton introduced H.R. 1255, a bill that proposes to make up for the incalculable loss of opportunities by making the direct descendants of Black World War II veterans eligible for Veterans Administration housing loans and education benefits; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the 135th General Assembly of the State of Ohio, in adopting this resolution, urge the Congress of the United States to enact H.R. 1255 of the 118th Congress, to extend to Black veterans of World War II, and surviving spouses and certain direct descendants of such veterans, eligibility for housing loans and educational assistance administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the Speaker and Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore and Secretary of the United States Senate, each member of the Ohio Congressional delegation, and the news media of Ohio.
