A BILL

To amend section 4501.21 and to enact sections 1
4503.541, 5533.106, 5534.013, 5534.427, 2
5534.429, 5534.443, 5534.482, 5534.505, 3
5534.617, 5534.673, 5534.8710, 5534.926, and 4
5534.966 of the Revised Code to make multiple 5
highway designations. 6

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and sections 7
4503.541, 5533.106, 5534.013, 5534.427, 5534.429, 5534.443, 8
5534.482, 5534.505, 5534.617, 5534.673, 5534.8710, 5534.926, and 9
5534.966 of the Revised Code be enacted to read as follows: 10

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state 11
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall 12
consist of all contributions for specialty license plates paid 13
by motor vehicle registrants and collected by the registrar of 14
motor vehicles pursuant to the Revised Code sections referenced 15
in division (B) of this section. 16

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who have pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to

the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide 76
children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund 77
research for the cure of childhood cancers. 78

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 79
receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the 80
future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the 81
contributions into its general account to be used for 82
educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of 83
America foundation. 84

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 85
receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 86
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 87
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 88
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 89

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 90
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 91
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 92
scholarships and other educational activities. 93

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 94
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 95
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 96
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 97
that organization. 98

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 99
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 100
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 101
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 102
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 103

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 104

pursuant to section 4503.507 of the Revised Code to the Ohio aerospace institute, which shall use those contributions to facilitate student internships in aerospace and educational programming.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.508 of the Revised Code to the organization bottoms up diaper drive to provide funding for that organization for collecting and delivering diapers to parents in need.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.509 of the Revised Code to a kid again, incorporated for distribution in equal amounts to the Ohio chapters of a kid again.

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the university or college whose name or marking or design appears on collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that section. A university or college that receives contributions from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general scholarship fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.516 of the Revised Code to Marshall university in Huntington, West Virginia, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with Marshall university to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.517 of the Revised Code to the university of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Alabama, for purposes of awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the university of Alabama to effectuate the distribution of such funds as provided in this section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.518 of the Revised Code to the Nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions for the "On Our Sleeves" campaign.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.519 of the Revised Code equally to NAMI Ohio (national alliance on mental illness of Ohio), Ohio peer recovery organizations, and OCAAR (Ohio citizen advocates for addiction recovery).

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying

for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 164
cyclists of all ages. 165

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 166
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 167
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 168
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 169
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 170
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 171
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 174
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 175
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 176
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 178
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 179
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 180
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 181
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 182

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 183
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 184
United States power squadron district seven which shall annually 185
distribute the contributions in equal amounts to all United 186
States power squadrons located in the state. Each power squadron 187
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 188
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 189
sponsors within this state. 190

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 191
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 192

Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 193
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 194
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 195
activities. 196

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 197
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 198
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 199
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 200
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 201
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 202

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 203
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 204
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 205
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 206
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 207
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 208
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 209
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 210
the improvement of patient outcomes. 211

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 212
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 213
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 214
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 215
organization in paying for the charitable activities and 216
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 217
personnel, veterans, and their families. 218

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 219
receives pursuant to section 4503.532 of the Revised Code to the 220
Ohio history connection, which shall use the contributions for 221
the benefit of the Paul Laurence Dunbar house. 222

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.533 of the Revised Code to the nonprofit organization Ohio conference of teamsters and industry health and welfare fund, which shall use the contributions to further the nonprofit's mission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for programs that serve disabled American veterans and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.541 of the Revised Code to Dolly Parton's imagination library of Ohio. The library shall use the money it receives under this section for operational costs, including the distribution of books.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel destination.

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state.

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the

contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 252
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 253
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 254
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 255
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 256
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 257
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 258
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 259
pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 260
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 261

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 262
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 263
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 264

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 265
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 266
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 267
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 268
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 269
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 270
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 271
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 272
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 273
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 274
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 275
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 276
under this section. 277

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 278
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 279
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 280
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 281

programs.	282
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the western reserve historical society, which shall use the contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum.	283 284 285 286
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the contributions for charitable and educational purposes.	287 288 289 290 291
The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory the person who paid the contribution resides.	292 293 294 295 296 297
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.559 of the Revised Code to playhouse square, located in Cleveland, Ohio, which shall use the contributions to further its mission of presenting and producing a wide variety of quality performing arts, advancing arts education, and creating a superior destination for entertainment, business, and residential living.	298 299 300 301 302 303 304
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of	305 306 307 308 309 310

ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 311
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 312
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 313
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 314
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 315
such payments are to be made. 316

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 317
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 318
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 319
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 320
river watershed. 321

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 322
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to the 323
Glen Helen association to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen 324
nature preserve. 325

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 326
receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the 327
conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use 328
the money in support of the park. 329

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 330
receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the 331
Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the 332
contributions for wildlife preservation purposes. 333

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 334
receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the 335
girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the 336
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 337

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 338
receives pursuant to section 4503.569 of the Revised Code to the 339

Ohio bird sanctuary, located in Mansfield, Ohio, which shall use 340
the contributions for purposes of its operations, bird care and 341
rehabilitation, and educational programs. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343
receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the 344
Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those 345
contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational 346
information about beekeeping, and to support other state and 347
local beekeeping programs. 348

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 349
receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the 350
national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the 351
contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace 352
legends to inspire future leaders. 353

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 354
receives pursuant to section 4503.578 of the Revised Code to 355
keep Ohio beautiful, incorporated, which shall use the 356
contributions towards its mission of empowering Ohio communities 357
to take greater responsibility for improving the local 358
environment through litter prevention, beautification, community 359
greening, waste reduction, and recycling. 360

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 361
receives pursuant to section 4503.579 of the Revised Code to the 362
national council of negro women, incorporated, which shall use 363
the contributions for educational purposes. 364

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 365
receives pursuant to section 4503.581 of the Revised Code to the 366
Ohio past detachment commander's club, inc., which shall use the 367
contributions to support the activities of the organization. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.582 of the Revised Code to the progressive animal welfare society adoption center, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the center.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.583 of the Revised Code to the American legion, department of Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.584 of the Revised Code to the Ohio natural energy institute to fund scholarships for students pursuing careers in the oil and natural gas industry.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective of the county of residence of an applicant.

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is participating in the license plate program pursuant to division (G) of that section.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to

pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 398
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 399
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 400
Ohio and for educational programs. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 403
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 404
supporting cancer research. 405

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 406
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 407
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 408

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 409
receives pursuant to section 4503.596 of the Revised Code to the 410
Cuyahoga valley scenic railroad. 411

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 412
receives pursuant to section 4503.597 of the Revised Code to the 413
Circleville pumpkin show, incorporated, which shall use the 414
contributions to promote good will surrounding the Circleville 415
pumpkin show as a nonprofit annual event. 416

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 417
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 418
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 419
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 420
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 421

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 422
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 423
girl scouts of Ohio's heartland. The girl scouts of Ohio's 424
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 425
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 426

scouts. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 429
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 430
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 431
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433
receives pursuant to section 4503.70 of the Revised Code to the 434
charitable foundation of the grand lodge of Ohio, f. & a. m., 435
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 436

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 437
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 438
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 439
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 440

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 441
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 442
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 443
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 444
charitable purposes. 445

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 446
receives pursuant to section 4503.703 of the Revised Code to the 447
Ohio state moose association. 448

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 449
receives pursuant to section 4503.704 of the Revised Code to the 450
Antioch shrine foundation located in the municipal corporation 451
of Dayton. 452

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 453
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 454
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 455

deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 456
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 457

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 458
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 459
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 460
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 461
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 462
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 463
methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 464

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 465
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 466
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 467
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 468
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 469
in the line of duty. 470

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 471
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 472
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 473
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 474
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 475

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 476
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 477
association of chiefs of police. 478

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 479
receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.715 of the 480
Revised Code to the community foundation of Ohio's electric 481
cooperatives, which shall use the contributions to recognize and 482
memorialize fallen or injured lineworkers and support their 483
families. 484

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.716 of the Revised Code to the fallen timbers battlefield preservation commission, which shall use the contributions to further the mission of the commission.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in administering a program to secure the proper representation in the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent children, and for the training and supervision of persons participating in that program.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.724 of the Revised Code to the Ohio Chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, which shall use the contributions for programs, education, and advocacy purposes throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives, or has received, pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the ALS united Ohio, incorporated, which shall split the contributions between that organization and the ALS association in accordance with any agreement between the two organizations. The contributions shall be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for, and

empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the 515
fullest. 516

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 517
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 518
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 519
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 520
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 521

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 522
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 523

Cincinnati. The school shall use fifty per cent of the 1148

contributions it receives to provide tuition assistance to its 1149
students, twenty-five per cent of the contributions to benefit 1150
arts and enrichment at the school, and twenty-five per cent of 1151
the contributions to benefit athletics at the school. 1152

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1153
receives pursuant to section 4503.961 of the Revised Code to 1154
Fairfield senior high school located in the municipal 1155
corporation of Fairfield. The high school shall not use the 1156
contributions for any political purpose. 1157

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1158
receives pursuant to section 4503.962 of the Revised Code to 1159
Hamilton high school located in the municipal corporation of 1160
Hamilton. The high school shall not use the contributions for 1161
any political purpose. 1162

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1163
receives pursuant to section 4503.963 of the Revised Code to 1164
Ross high school located in Ross township in Butler county. The 1165
high school shall not use the contributions for any political 1166
purpose. 1167

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1168
receives pursuant to section 4503.964 of the Revised Code to 1169
Chardon hilltopper gridiron club. The club shall use 1170
contributions to fund college and career technical training 1171
scholarships for students. 1172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 1173
receives pursuant to section 4503.97 of the Revised Code to the 1174
friends of united Hatzalah of Israel, which shall use the money 1175
to support united Hatzalah of Israel, which provides free 1176
emergency medical first response throughout Israel. 1177

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.98 of the Revised Code to the Westerville parks foundation to support the programs and activities of the foundation and its mission of pursuing the city of Westerville's vision of becoming "A City Within A Park."

(C) All investment earnings of the license plate contribution fund shall be credited to the fund. Not later than the first day of May of every year, the registrar shall distribute to each entity described in division (B) of this section the investment income the fund earned the previous calendar year. The amount of such a distribution paid to an entity shall be proportionate to the amount of money the entity received from the fund during the previous calendar year.

Sec. 4503.541. (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle and issuance of "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates. The application may be combined with a request for a special reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code.

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily inscribed on the license plates, "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates shall display an appropriate logo and

(B) "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates 1210
and a validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be 1211

the state treasury to the credit of the license plate 1226
contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised 1227
Code. 1228

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1229
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1230
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1231
of "Dolly Parton's Imagination Library" license plates, into the 1232
state treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway 1233
purposes fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1234

(D)(1) Section 4503.78 of the Revised Code does not apply 1235
to license plates issued under this section. 1236

(2) County identification stickers are not required for 1237
license plates issued under this section. 1238
