Of the foregoing appropriation item 360400, Holocaust and846Genocide Memorial and Education Commission, \$150,000 in each847fiscal year shall be used for recording the stories and848

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testimonials of genocide survivors living in Ohio, as well as 849 veterans or active duty military personnel involved in 850 operations related to eliminating genocide. 851

Funding may be used 871 for transportation, admission, security, and other related 872 costs-, including those incurred by the education and memorial 873 museums to facilitate such visits. Funding shall not be used for 874 trips to the Ohio Statehouse, including visits to the Ohio 875 Holocaust and Liberators Memorial. 876

Of the foregoing appropriation item 360400, Holocaust and 877 Genocide Memorial and Education Commission, \$150,000 in each 878

fiscal year shall be used to support the development of teacher 879 training courses at colleges and universities related to 880 instruction on the Holocaust as well as other approved 881 programming by the Commission. 882 The Commission, in partnership with the Department of 883 Education and Workforce and the Department of Higher Education, 884 shall submit two reports of findings and recommendations to the 885 general assembly and the governor not later than June 30 of each 886 fiscal year regarding the impact of such funding, reach, and any 887 888 recommended changes to the programming. #### SECURITY GRANTS

(A) The foregoing appropriation item 763513, Security 971
Grants, shall be used to make competitive grants of up to 972
\$100,000 to nonprofit organizations, houses of worship, 973
chartered nonpublic schools, and licensed preschools for all of 974
the following purposes: 975

(1) Eligible security improvements that assist the
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 organization in preventing, preparing for, or responding to acts
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 of terrorism;
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(2) Acquiring or retaining the services of a resourceofficer, special duty police officer, or licensed armed securityguards, including the training, licensing, or certification ofresource officers;

(3) The lease or purchase of qualified equipment,
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including equipment for emergency and crisis communication,
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crisis management, or trauma and crisis response to assist in
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preventing, preparing for, or responding to acts of terrorism;
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(4) Placing the qualified equipment at alternative
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locations that are off the premises belonging to the grantee,
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provided that the grantee receives prior permission from any
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appropriate county, municipal corporation, local law enforcement
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agency, local emergency management agency, or local
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transportation agency, as applicable;
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(5) Funding coordinated training between law enforcement, 993

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counterterrorism agencies, and emergency responders on either 994 the premises of a nonprofit corporation or through community- 995 wide training efforts; 996

(6) Continuing coverage of costs that were authorized and
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 paid for by a grant issued previously to the grantee in
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 accordance with this section in previous bienniums under the
 999
 program.

(B) (1) In addition to the purposes listed in division (A) 1001 1002 of this section, a nonprofit organization that serves a broad community or geographic area may apply for and receive grants to 1003 provide antiterrorism related services for its serviced 1004 community or area, including providing armed security personnel. 1005 Prior to receiving a grant under division (B) of this section, 1006 the nonprofit organization shall provide the Emergency 1007 Management Agency with any appropriate compliance documentation. 1008 The Agency shall establish what compliance documentation is 1009 required prior to issuing grants under this division. 1010

(2) If more than one nonprofit organization is located at
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the same address listed on the application, each nonprofit
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organization may apply for the full amount of a grant issued
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under this section. Each nonprofit organization shall explain in
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its application how it will use the grant money to address a
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different vulnerability than the other applicant nonprofit
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organizations that are located at the same address.

(C) The Emergency Management Agency shall administer and
award the grants described in divisions (A) and (B) of this
section. The Agency shall establish procedures and forms by
which applicants may apply for a grant, a competitive process
for ranking applicants and awarding the grants, and procedures
for distributing grants to recipients. The procedures shall

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require each applicant to do all of the following:

(1) Identify and substantiate prior threats or attacks by
 a terrorist organization, network, or cell against the nonprofit

 organization, house of worship, chartered nonpublic school, or

 licensed preschool;

(2) Indicate the symbolic or strategic value of one or 1029more sites that renders the site a possible target of terrorism; 1030

(3) Discuss potential consequences to the organization if1031the site is damaged, destroyed, or disrupted by a terrorist;1032

(4) Describe how the grant will be used to integrate
organizational preparedness with broader state and local
preparedness efforts;

(5) Submit either a vulnerability assessment conducted by 1036 experienced security, law enforcement, or military personnel, or 1037 a credible intelligence and threat analysis from one or more 1038 qualified homeland security, counterintelligence, or antiterrorism experts, and a description of how the grant will be 1040 used to address the vulnerabilities identified in the 1041 assessment. 1042

The Agency shall consider all of the above factors in1043evaluating grant applications. The grantee shall have twenty-1044four months from the date of the first disbursement to meet1045program requirements. The Agency shall include information about1046the grants and the application process on its web site.1047

The Emergency Management Agency may prioritize a portion1048of funding, but not more than \$1,000,000 in each fiscal year,1049for innovative community-public safety partnerships addressing1050counterterrorism prevention, provided the grantee is eligible to1051receive the grant as a nonprofit organization that is at risk of1052
